UNIVERSITIES OF OXFORD AND CAMBRIDGE ACT 1923

1. A Statute made by the Governing Body of Jesus College, in the University of Oxford on 2nd March 1988, amending Statute IV has been submitted for the approval of Her Majesty in Council, and notice of its submission is published in accordance with the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1923. The Statute modifies provisions relating to the election of Junior Research Fellows.

2. A Statute made by the Governing Body of Lincoln College, in the University of Oxford on 26th February 1988, amending College Statutes II and IV has been submitted for the approval of Her Majesty in Council, and notice of its submission is published in accordance with the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1923. The purpose of the Statute is to add a new form of Fellowship, to modify the rights of Extraordinary Fellows and to remove the Bursar's automatic entitlement to sabbatical leave.

3. A Statute made by the Governing Body of St. John's College, in the University of Oxford on 29th February 1988, amending Statutes IV and V has been submitted for the approval of Her Majesty in Council, and notice of its submission is published in accordance with the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1923. The purpose of this amendment is to bring the retirement age for Fellows and College Officers into line with that of those holding University Academic Posts.

Telford Development Corporation: Extinguishment of Public Rights of Way over part of highway off Sommerfeld Road, Trench Lock, Telford.

Notice is hereby given, that the Secretary of State for the Environment, in exercise of his powers under section 23 of the New Towns Act 1981, proposes to make an Order extinguishing the public rights of way over the following route shown coloured red on the map hereinafter referred to:

That part of the highway off Sommerfeld Road, Trench Lock, which runs from a point marked A on the map, (located approximately 63 metres south-east of the junction of Sommerfeld Road and Trench Lock Road 5) for a distance of approximately 19 metres in a south-westerly direction to a point marked B on the map.
