NEW TOWNS ACT 1981

Telford Development Corporation: Extinguishment of Public Rights of Way at Walney Court, Wilmere Court and Wenlock Court, Woodside.

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for the Environment, in exercise of his powers under section 23 of the New Towns Act 1981, proposes to make an Order extinguishing the public rights of way over the following routes shown coloured on the map hereinafter referred to:

That length of footpath starting at a point marked A on the map (between numbers 2 and 3 Walney Court) and running in an easterly, then southerly, then easterly, then northerly direction along the line of the connecting ramp to Wilmere Court for a total distance of approximately 40 metres to a point marked B (adjacent to number 26 Wilmere Court).

That length of footpath starting at a point marked C on the map (between numbers 10 and 11 Walney Court) and running in a southerly, then westerly, then southerly direction for a total distance of approximately 35 metres to a point marked D (at the junction with the main spine footpath to the Woodside Local Centre).

That length of footpath starting at a point marked E on the map (adjacent to garage number 23 of the Garage Court for Wilmere Court) and running in a southerly direction for a distance of approximately 15 metres to a point marked F.

That length of footpath starting at a point marked G on the map (adjacent to number 15 Wilmere Court) and running in a southerly, then westerly, then southerly direction for a total distance of approximately 27 metres to a point marked H (at the junction with the main spine footpath to the Woodside Local Centre).

That length of footpath starting at a point marked J on the map (between numbers 8 and 9 Wilmere Court) and running in a generally south-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 15 metres to a point marked K (at the junction with the main spine footpath to the Woodside Local Centre).

WILDLIFE AND COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1981, SECTION 3

Area of Special Protection Horsey Estate

Notice is hereby given that on 24th February 1988 the Secretary of State for the Environment acting under section 3(1) of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981, made the Horsey Estate (Area of Special Protection) Order 1988, applying sections 3(1)(a) and (b) to an area of land owned by the National Trust and occupied and managed by Mr J. Buxton (Horsey Hall, Great Yarmouth, Norfolk), situated adjacent to Horsey Mere near the village of Horsey, Norfolk. The Order is reproduced in the annex to this notice. A map of the area concerned may be inspected free of charge at the offices of North Norfolk District Council, Holt Road, Cromer, Norfolk, or at the offices of the Department of the Environment, Room 9/08, Tollgate House, Houlton Street, Bristol, at all reasonable hours.

The Order which took effect on 17th March establishes an area of special protection for wild birds and makes it an offence for anyone other than the National Trust, Mr Buxton or anyone authorised by them to enter into the area at any time in any year, and an offence for anyone other than an authorised person or a person exercising any right vested in him, whether as owner, lessee or occupier of any land in that area or by virtue of a licence or agreement, to intentionally:

- (a) kill, injure or take any bird;
- (b) take, damage or destroy the nest of such a bird while that nest is in use or being built;
- (c) take or destroy an egg of any wild bird;
- (d) disturb any wild bird while it is building a nest or it is in, on or near a nest containing eggs or young; or
- (e) disturb dependent young of any wild bird.

Any person committing an offence within the area of special protection would be liable to a fine not exceeding Level 5 on the standard scale (currently £2,000).
