Notice is hereby given that East Sussex County Council proposes to make an Order under sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) to (3) and 4(2) of, and Part IV of Schedule 9 to, the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 which will make a number of alterations to traffic management in the Hastings Town Centre area

These alterations are required in connection with the Town Centre Road Scheme which is associated with the development of the Hastings Central Cricket Ground. It is intended that the proposals contained in the above draft Order will facilitate the safe and convenient flow of traffic to, from and through the town centre.

The main effect of the proposals will be:

(a) to remove 'One-Way' traffic restrictions from some roads in the town centre and to reimpose 'One-Way' restrictions in some cases on roads which are at present subject to two-way traffic, in order to control the flow of traffic in this area;

(b) to alter the waiting and loading/unloading restrictions along a number of roads in the town centre, thereby ensuring the free flow of traffic;

(c) to prohibit traffic except for buses, pedal cycles and emergency services vehicles; and except for vehicles wishing to load/unload during certain permitted hours, from using part of Queen's Road;
(d) to alter the location of the taxi rank in Havelock Road,

and to remove the taxi rank in Queen's Road and the disabled drivers' parking place in Cornwallis Terrace (near

its junction with Priory Street);
(e) to prohibit certain vehicles from making right-hand turns from Harold Place into Carlisle Parade; from Middle Street into Station Approach; or from Robertson Street into Harold Place; and

(f) to prohibit vehicles from entering Robertson Street at its

junction with Harold Place.

Exceptions are included in the above proposals where appropriate for emergency services vehicles, local authority vehicles and disabled persons' vehicles; to permit picking-up and setting down passengers, loading and unloading goods, roadworks and the maintenance of essential services, and for

bullion vehicles.
