WATER ACT 1945

Sutton District Water

Notice is hereby given that the Sutton District Water Company are about to apply to the Secretary of State for the Environment for an Order under sections 23, 32, 33, 50 and 59(1) of the Water Act 1945.

The counties and districts affected by the proposed Order are the county of Surrey, the London boroughs of Croydon, Merton and Sutton, the borough of Epsom and Ewell and the borough of Reigate and Banstead.

4. To provide for the permanent lighting of the intended works and the taking of such other steps for the prevention of danger to navigation as Associated British Ports may direct.
5. To provide for the lighting of the intended works during their erection, construction, renewal, extension, enlargement or alteration and for taking of such other steps for the prevention of danger to navigation as the Secretary of State for Trade and A.B. Ports may direct.
6. To provide for the approval of the intended works by the Secretary of State and A.B. Ports, for the making of surveys of the intended works and for the abatement thereof in certain circumstances.
7. To prescribe the limits within which the Board and their berthing master may exercise jurisdiction, to authorise the Board to make byelaws and to incorporate provisions of the Harbours, Docks and Piers Clauses Act 1847.

HARBOURS ACT 1964

Fawley Jetty Empowerment

Notice is hereby given that the Central Electricity Generating Board (hereinafter referred to as "the Board") have applied to the Secretary of State for Transport to make a Harbour Empowerment Order under section 16 of the Harbours Act 1964.

The objects of the proposed Order are:

1. To authorise the Board to construct, maintain, renew, extend, enlarge and alter the following works partly in the district of New Forest in the county of Hampshire and partly on the bed or shore of Southampton Water:

Work No. 1. A jetty approach of open work construction (together with a structure incorporating enclosed materials handling systems) commencing at the shoreline of Southampton Water, at National Grid reference point SU102910 447270, extending in a north-easterly direction for a distance of 1,130 metres or thereabouts and terminating at National Grid reference point SU103770 448000;

Work No. 2. A jetty head of open work construction (together with a structure incorporating enclosed materials handling systems) commencing at a point 25 metres or thereabouts north-west of the termination of Work No. 1 and thence extending in a south-easterly direction for a distance of 650 metres or thereabouts and there terminating.

2. To authorise the Board to acquire land (being part of the bed or shore of Southampton Water) or easements thereover for the purposes of the intended works, to enter for survey or valuation and to extinguish private rights of way.

3. To empower the Board to erect, construct and maintain subsidiary works in connection with the intended works, to deviate in the construction of the intended works and to carry out dredging operations in Southampton Water and to enact provisions regarding obstruction of the intended works.
