CLEVELAND COUNTY COUNCIL

*The County Council of Cleveland (A66 South Bank and
Grangetown By-Pass) (50 m.p.h. Speed Limit) Order 1988*

Notice is hereby given that on 23rd March 1988 the Cleveland County Council made an Order under section 84 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. The new Order comes into effect on 29th March 1988.

DORSET COUNTY COUNCIL

*The County of Dorset (Various Roads, Ferndown)
(Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1988*

Notice is hereby given that the Dorset County Council have made an Order under sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) to (3), 4(2) of the Road-Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

When the Order comes into effect on 25th March 1988, waiting will be prohibited at any time on the following lengths of road:

- (a) Penrose Road, on both sides for a distance of 65 metres from its junction with Victoria Road;
- (b) Victoria Gardens, on both sides for a distance of 66 metres from its junction with Victoria Road;
- (c) Westwood Avenue, on both sides for a distance of 15 metres from its junction with Victoria Road;
- (d) Bramley Road, on both sides for a distance of 68 metres from its junction with Victoria Road.

Exemptions will permit waiting for picking up or setting down passengers, loading or unloading goods, disabled persons' vehicles bearing the relevant "orange badge", post office vehicles delivering and collecting mail, emergency service vehicles and where necessary, in connection with any building or demolition operation, the maintenance of the road, the supply of gas, water or electricity and works to any telegraphic line.

A copy of the Order and a plan showing the lengths of road affected are available for inspection during normal office hours, Monday to Friday at East Dorset District Council, Council Offices, Furzehill, Wimborne BH21 4HN and Transportation and Engineering Department, Dorset County Council, County Hall, Dorchester, Dorset.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it, on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may, within 6 weeks from the date of this Notice apply to the High Court for this purpose.
