

NOTTINGHAMSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

*The Nottinghamshire County Council
(Albion Street/Wollaton Road Area, Beeston)
(Traffic Regulation) Order 1988*

Notice is hereby given that the Nottinghamshire County Council has made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, the effect of which (respecting roads at Beeston in the Borough of Broxtowe) will be:

- (1) Vehicles will be prohibited from waiting at any time on Cross Street. This prohibition will also be extended around the corner onto Wollaton Road (towards High Road);
- (2) Vehicles will be prohibited from waiting at any time in the new Albion Street/Cross Street Link Road;
- (3) The one-way traffic restrictions on Villa Street/Vernon Avenue will be reversed from the present direction so that vehicles may only proceed from north-east to north-west;
- (4) Existing restrictions in the area will be included in the Order.

The usual exemptions will be provided. Relevant documents may be inspected at my Office or at the Library, Foster Avenue, Beeston, Nottingham. Any person wishing to question the validity of the Order or any of the provisions contained in it on the grounds that they are not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or any Instrument made under it, has not been complied with in relation to the Order may, not later than 28th April 1988, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

The Order will come into operation on 27th March 1988.

*The Nottinghamshire County Council (Broadgate, Albert Road and University Boulevard, Beeston and Nottingham)
(Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1988*

Notice is hereby given that the Nottinghamshire County Council has made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, the effect of which (in respect of roads at Beeston in the Borough of Broxtowe and in the city of Nottingham) will be:

- (1) Vehicles will be prohibited from waiting at any time in certain parts of the following roads: Albert Road and Broadgate;
- (2) Vehicles will be prohibited from waiting between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive in certain parts of the following roads: Broadgate and University Boulevard.

The usual exemptions will be provided. Relevant documents may be inspected at my Office or at the Office of the Secretary and Solicitor, Nottingham City Council, The Guildhall, Nottingham or at the Library, Foster Avenue, Beeston, Nottingham. Any person wishing to question the validity of the Order or any of the provisions contained in it on the grounds that they are not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or any Instrument made under it, has not been complied with in relation to the Order may, not later than 27th April 1988, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

The Order will come into operation on 26th March 1988.

*The Leicestershire County Council (Granby Street (Part),
and Northampton Street (Part), Leicester)
(One-Way Traffic) Order 1988*

Notice is hereby given that the Leicestershire County Council has made an Order under sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) to (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which will be to:

- (1) Prohibit any vehicle from proceeding along the lengths of Roads specified in Column 1 of Schedule 1 to this Notice in a direction other than that specified in relation to those lengths of Roads in Column 2 of the said Schedule 1.
- (2) Prohibit any vehicle other than a Police Vehicle from proceeding along that length of road specified in Column 1 of Schedule 2 to this Notice.

The Order will come into force on Monday, 28th March 1988.

A copy of the Order and the relevant map is available for public inspection at County Hall, Glenfield, Leicester.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may, within 6 weeks from the date of this Notice apply to the High Court for this purpose.

Column 1 Lengths of Roads	Column 2 Direction of Flow
That length of Road known as Granby Street, Leicester which extends from its junction with London Road in a north-westerly direction to its junction with Northampton Street.	South-east to north-west
That length of Road known as Northampton Street, Leicester which extends from its junction with Granby Street in a north-easterly direction to its junction with Charles Street.	South-west to north-east
That length of Road in Charles Street, Leicester, known as the gap in the central reservation opposite Northampton Street.	South-west to north-east

Column 1 Length of Road	Column 2 Direction of Flow
That length of Road in Charles Street, Leicester known as the gap in the central reservation opposite Church Street.	North-east to south-west
