ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

The Staffordshire County Council (Werrington Road A52, Washerwall Lane and Salters Lane, Werrington) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1988

Notice is hereby given that the Staffordshire County Council on 22nd March 1988 made an Order under section 1(1) and (2), 2(1) to (3), 4(2) and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

This Order means that you are not allowed to leave your vehicle at any time on the lengths of roads specified in the Schedule to this Notice.

Exceptions permit waiting for the purposes of picking up and setting down of passengers, loading or unloading goods, for vehicles displaying a Disabled Person's Badge, and where necessary in connection with the maintenance of roads and the supply of gas, electricity and water and for emergency service vehicles.

This Order revokes that part of the County of Stafford (Washerwall Lane, Werrington) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 1982 which currently prohibits waiting on that part of Washerwall Lane, Werrington specified in the Schedule to this Notice.

Full details are in the Order which together with a map showing the restricted areas may be examined during normal office hours at my office and during normal opening hours at the Werrington Branch Library, Ashbank Road, Werrington, Stoke-on-Trent.

Any person who desires to question the validity of the Order or any provision contained in the Order on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the relevant sections of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or on the grounds that any requirement of those sections or of Parts I, II and III of Schedule 9 of the Act, or any regulations made under the said Part III of Schedule 9 of the Act has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within 6 weeks of the date on which the Order was made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

The Order will come into operation on 31st March 1988.

SCHEDULE

Werrington Road, A52, Werrington, on both sides from a point 73 metres south-west of its junction with Washerwall Lane to a point 89 metres north-east of that junction.

Washerwall Lane, Werrington, on both sides from its junction with Werrington Road for 76 metres in a north-westerly direction, including the splay at the south-east side of the junction with Stonehouse Road.

Salters Lane, Werrington, on both sides from its junction with Werrington Road for a distance of 93 metres in a south-easterly direction, including the splays at the junction with Salters Close.

Proposed Traffic Regulation Orders

Notice is hereby given that the East Staffordshire District Council pursuant to arrangements made under section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972 with the Staffordshire County Council propose to make Orders under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The effect of the Orders will be as follows:

*The East Staffordshire District Council (Various Roads, Burton-upon-Trent) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) (No. 1) Order 1988**(a) No Waiting at any Time*

Ashby Road (north side)

From its junction with Mervyn Road for a distance of 33 metres in a westerly direction.

Ashby Road (north side)

From its junction with Mervyn Road for a distance of 33 metres in an easterly direction.

Mervyn Road (both sides)

From its junction with Ashby Road for a distance of 15 metres in a northerly direction.

Newton Mews (both sides)

From its junction with Newton Road for a distance of 15 metres in an easterly direction.

Shobnall Road (north-east side)

From its junction with Shobnall Street for a distance of 700 metres in a north-westerly direction.

(b) No Waiting Between 8 a.m. and 7 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays Inclusive

New Street (south side)

From a point 38 metres from its junction with Orchard Street for a distance of 47 metres in a south-easterly direction.

*The Proposed East Staffordshire District Council (Wellington Road, Burton-upon-Trent) (Derestriction) Order 1988**The derestriction of the Speed Limit on the Following Section of Wellington Road.*

From a point 1260 metres from its junction with Shobnall Road for a distance of 1260 metres in a south-westerly direction.

*The Proposed East Staffordshire District Council (Union Street, Burton-upon-Trent) (Prohibition of Loading and Unloading) Order 1988**The Prohibition of Loading and Unloading on the Following Road*

Union Street (west side)

From its junction with Station Street to its junction with New Street.

The Proposed East Staffordshire District Council (Market Place, Burton-upon-Trent) (Controlled Zone) (Amendment) Order 1988

The provision of parking spaces for the disabled in the Market Place in the vicinity of the public conveniences.

The Proposed East Staffordshire District Council (Junction of Wetmore Road/Hawkins Lane, Burton-upon-Trent) (Experimental Prohibition of Driving) Order 1988

The Closure of Wetmore Road at its junction with Hawkins Lane for an experimental period of six months.

The Proposed East Staffordshire District Council (Mead Crescent and Manor Crescent, Burton-upon-Trent) (One-Way Traffic) Order 1988

The implementation of a one-way system in a clockwise direction at Mead Crescent and Manor Crescent, i.e.

*Length of Road in Burton-upon-Trent**Direction*

That length of Mead Crescent which extends from its junction with Mead Walk to its junction with Manor Walk.

From north-west to south-east.

That length of Manor Crescent which extends from a point 30 metres from its junction with Manor Road to its junction with Mead Walk.

From south-east to north-west.

Full details of the proposals are in the draft Orders which together with maps showing the areas affected and statements of the Council's reasons for making the Orders, may be examined at the Town Hall, Burton-upon-Trent from Monday to Friday between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m.

If you wish to object to the proposed Orders you should send the grounds for your objections in writing to the undersigned by 22nd April 1988.
