Designation of Conservation Areas—Sileby & Thurcaston

Notice is hereby given that the Charnwood Borough Council has designated the areas specified in the schedule hereto as conservation areas pursuant to section 277 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 (as amended). The purpose of the designations is to preserve or enhance the character or appearance of areas which are of special architectural or historic interest and to ensure that special architectural or historic interest and to ensure that special

Listed Building Control applies to all buildings specified by the Secretary of State; anyone wishing to demolish a building in a conservation area must first apply for Listed Building Consent to the Local Planning Authority. Advertisements in conservation areas may be controlled by the Local Planning Authority to avoid detraction from the appearance of the areas, and trees in conservation areas are protected by the Act against felling, topping, lopping, uprooting and wilful damage.

Sileby Conservation Area—The area bounded by 31 Barrow Road and rear curtilages of properties 9 to 31, turning west along rear curtilages of properties on Mountsorrel Lane to include 42, crossing Mountsorrel Lane to include the Rectory, rear curtilage of Church Farm buildings and properties on Little Church Lane and High Street (including the Maltings), following the rear curtilage of the Hall and properties on Cossington Road up to and including the Conservative Club, crossing Cossington Road and skirting rear boundaries of 29 to 43, the Baptist Church and Free Trade Public House, in front of the Village Institute to include 1 to 19 Cossington Road, and grounds in front of Dudley Court, continuing into Brook Street but excluding properties in Back Lane to meet the railway line, following the railway line north and crossing back to include 96 Barrow Road.
