The Wigan Borough (Princess Road, Ashton) (Restriction of Waiting) Order 1988

Notice is hereby given that the Wigan Borough Council, in exercise of the powers under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, proposes to make the Wigan Borough (Princess Road, Ashton) (Restriction of Waiting) Order 1988.

The effect of the Order will be to restrict waiting in Princess Road and York Road as follows:

Princess Road: (North east side)—from a point 83.82 metres south east of Gerard Street to a point 15 metres east of Ladysmith Avenue.

Princess Road: (South side)—from York Road to a point 15 metres east of York Road.

York Road: (Both sides)—from Princess Road for a distance of 15 metres.

From 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday to Saturday.

There will be limited exceptions permitting vehicles to wait—

- (a) to enable people to board or alight;
- (b) for the purpose of building and similar operations, removing obstructions to traffic, road works and works by statutory undertakers;
- (c) for local authority, water authority and Post Office purposes;
- (d) if the vehicles are fire service or police vehicles or ambulances;
- (e) to take on fuel, water or air at any garage; or
- (f) for the delivery or collection of goods and for loading or unloading.

The Wigan Borough (Church Road/Coach Road, Astley) (Restriction of Waiting) Order 1988

Notice is hereby given that the Wigan Borough Council, in exercise of the powers under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, proposes to make the Wigan Borough (Church Road/Coach Road, Astley) (Restriction of Waiting) Order 1988.

The effect of the Order will be to restrict waiting at Church Road/Coach Road, Astley as follows:

1. *Church Road*—both sides from a point 10 metres north east of its junction with Coach Road for a distance of 65 metres in a south-westerly direction.

2. *Coach Road*—both sides from its junction with Church Road for a distance of 15 metres in a south-easterly direction at any time.

There will be limited exceptions permitting vehicles to wait—

- (a) to enable people to board or alight;
- (b) for the purpose of building and similar operations, removing obstructions to traffic, road works and works by statutory undertakers;
- (c) for local authority, water authority and Post Office purposes;
- (d) if the vehicles are fire service or police vehicles or ambulances;
- (e) to take on fuel, water or air at any garage; or

(f) for the delivery or collection of goods and for loading or unloading.

Notice is hereby given that on 5th February 1988 the Stoke-on-Trent City Council resolved that an area within the City surrounding Park Terrace, Tunstall be designated a Conservation Area pursuant to section 277 of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1971 as amended by the Town and Country Amenities Act, 1974. The effect of the Designation will be as follows:

1. Certain buildings within the Conservation Area may not be demolished without the consent of either the Stoke-on-Trent City Council and/or the Secretary of State for the Environment.

2. Any person proposing to do work on trees in the area must give 6 weeks prior notice to the Stoke-on-Trent City Council of his intention unless the trees are protected by a Tree Preservation Order in which case the prior consent of the Stoke-on-Trent City Council must be obtained under section 61(4) of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1971.

3. The Stoke-on-Trent City Council has formulated proposals for the preservation and enhancement of the Area and has resolved to make an Article 4 Direction.

4. Any planning applications received by the Stoke-on-Trent City Council which affect the character or appearance of the Area will be published.

A plan of the Area is available for inspection at my office situated at the Town Hall, Stoke-on-Trent and at the offices of the Director of Planning and Architecture situate at Unity House, Hanley.
