Rating of Unoccupied Property

Notice is hereby given that in accordance with section 17(3) of the General Rate Act 1967, on 16th March 1988, the Council passed the following resolution:

Resolved: That, pursuant to the provisions of section 17 and Schedule 1 of the General Rate Act 1967 (as amended) as from 1st April 1988, the owners of unoccupied properties in the following classes of hereditaments be rated at the current ceiling of one half of the rates which would be payable by the said owners if they were in occupation of the hereditaments, viz:

- (i) commercial hereditaments having a rateable value exceeding £50;
- (ii) all other hereditaments having a rateable value exceeding £50; but excluding
 1. industrial and storage hereditaments as defined in The Rating (Exemption of Unoccupied Industrial and Storage Hereditaments) Regulations 1985;
 2. dwellinghouses as defined in section 115 of the General Rate 1967;
 3. mixed hereditaments where the domestic part is more than one half of the rateable value; and
 4. hereditaments having a floor area not exceeding 240 square feet and used as a lock up garage.
