Prohibition of Turns, Hall Ings/Bridge Street, Bradford

Notice is hereby given that City of Bradford Metropolitan Council made the above Order on 24th March 1988 under its powers contained in the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which will be as described in the Notice of Proposals (ref. No. 742) previously published in Issue No. 51126 of the *London Gazette* on 20th November 1987.
