Notice is hereby given that, the City of Wakefield Metropolitan District Council propose subject to the consent of the Secretary of State for Transport to make the above Order under their powers in the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which will be to restrict access to Brook Street, Wakefield between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays

(a) vehicles engaged in the delivery or collection of goods at premises abutting Brook Street provided that the vehicles only wait for up to 30 minutes whilst engaged in such

activities and

(b) restricted categories of disabled persons vehicles ie invalid carriages or any other vehicle which because of the nature of the owners disability is exempt from the payment of road tax, provided that all such vehicles only wait for up to 2 hours and they display a special permit which will be obtainable from the District Council if and when the Order is brought in force

The Order will prohibit casual access by vehicles to Brook Street (ie picking up and setting down of passengers will not be allowed) and prohibit parking by "Orange Badge" holders other than those referred to in (b) above.

Opportunity is being taken in this Order to revoke and re-enact the existing restrictions in Brook Street ie one-way traffic

and waiting and loading restrictions.

A copy of the draft Order, together with a map showing the restricted road and a statement of reasons for proposing to make restricted road and a statement of reasons for proposing to make the Order, may be examined during normal office hours at the Information Office, Town Hall, Wakefield and at the Council's Traffic Unit, Chantry House, Kirkgate, Wakefield.

(Amendment No.) Order 198

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the London Borough of Hackney propose to make the above-mentioned Order under sections 6 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by Part I of Schedule 5 to the Local Government Act 1985.

The general effect of the Order would be further to amend the Hackney (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Order 1977, so

(a) waiting by vehicles (otherwise than for the purpose of delivering, or collecting goods or loading or unloading a vehicle) would be prohibited:

(ii) between 8 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. throughout the week in the lengths of street specified in Schedule 1 to this Notice;
(ii) between 8 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive in the lengths of streets specified in Schedule 2 to this Notice

to this Notice.

(b) the sale or offer for sale of goods from a vehicle in the lengths of streets referred to in sub-paragraph (a) above would be prohibited, except on a Sunday, unless there is in force a valid licence issued by the London Borough of Hackney or the goods are immediately taken into or delivered at premises adjacent to the vehicle from which the sale is effected;

(c) the use of any vehicle or of any animal or the wearing of fancy dress or other costume, wholly or mainly for the purpose of advertising, in the lengths of street referred to in

purpose of advertising, in the lengths of street referred to in sub-paragraph (a) above would be prohibited.

The prohibitions and requirements referred to in paragraph 2(a) above would not apply in respect of anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform or in certain circumstances, e.g., the picking up or setting down of passengers; the carrying out of statutory powers or duties; the taking in of petrol, etc., from roadside petrol stations, to licensed street traders, etc. The usual exemption relating to vehicles displaying a disabled person's "Orange Badge" would apply.
