

DOVER DISTRICT COUNCIL

The Borough of Dover (Various Roads) (Consolidation of Waiting Restrictions and One-Way Traffic) (1974) (Amendment No. 2) Order 1988

Notice is hereby given that the District Council of Dover with the consent of the Kent County Council propose to make an Order under sections 1(1), 1(2), 2(1) to (3) and 4(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The effect of the Order will be to:

- (i) Anstee Road, introduce a total prohibition of waiting on both sides from the junction with Shooters Hill for a distance of 14 metres.
- (ii) Camden Crescent, between April and September each year substitute limited waiting outside of Nos. 1-2 for the total prohibition currently applicable.
- (iii) Park Place, extend the total prohibition of waiting on the south-east side in a north easterly direction for 6.5 metres.
- (iv) Shooters Hill, introduce a total prohibition of waiting on:
 - (a) the north-west side from Buckland Terrace to Anstee Road
 - (b) the south-east side in the vicinity of the junctions with Anstee Road and Buckland Terrace

BIRMINGHAM CITY COUNCIL

Conservation Area Centred upon St. Augustines Church, Edgbaston

Notice is hereby given in pursuance of section 277 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, as sub-titled by section 1 of the Town and Country Amenities Act 1974, that the city of Birmingham has determined that the area described in the Schedule to this Notice is an area of special architectural or historic interest the character or appearance of which it is desirable to preserve or enhance and has accordingly designated the said area as a conservation area. The area surrounding the church was planned by J. A. Chatwin and represents an environment characteristic of Birmingham's late Victorian development and illustrates the progression in architecture from gothic revival to arts and crafts in a very attractive contemporary setting. The affect of designation of the conservation area may be summarised as follows:

- (a) Where any application for planning permission for development of land in or adjacent to the conservation area is made to the Council and the development would, in the opinion of the Council affect the character or appearance of the conservation area the application will be subject to the special procedure in section 28 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, as amended.
- (b) Anyone wishing to demolish a building or a part of a building situate within the conservation area must first apply for consent for demolition to the local planning authority. Some buildings may be exempt from this requirement.
- (c) Anyone wishing to cut down top, lop or uproot a tree situate within the conservation area must give 6 weeks prior notice of his intention to the local planning authority.

A map of the conservation area may be inspected free of charge during normal office hours at the Development Department, Baskerville House, 1 Broad Street, Birmingham B1 2NA.
