Venice, June 9. N. S. Letters from Rome bring an Account, that the Pope, by the Advice of his Physicians, was removed to the Quirinale, which is thought to be seated in a better Air than the Vatican. Don Livio Odeschalchi had received the Order of the Golden Fleece with the usual Ceremonies, by the Hands of Count Boromeo, late Vice-Roy of Naples, and in the Evening he gave a magnificent Entertainment upon that Occasion. The Count being informed that the Coasts were infested with Privateers of Barbary, had alter'd his Resolution of going by Water to Genoa, and had sent back the two Neopolitan Gallies that were order'd to attend him. They write from Naples, that the Countess de Taun was arrived there. The new Vice-Roy had sent for all the Councils and Courts of Judicature, and exhorted them to be Severe and Regular in administering Justice. He hath acquainted the Pope, that he will not receive two of the Bishops lately named by him, because they are not Natives of the Country. The Clergy as well as the Laity are to pay the tenth Part of their Revenues to the Emperor. Signor Rubini, President of the Council of Naples, is removed from that Office. On the 29th past forty Tartanes sailed for Barcelona, in order to be employ'd in the Transportation of the Imperial Troops to Italy.

Hamburg, June 23. N. S. Prince Menzikoff hath already receiv'd half the Sum he had agreed for with this City, and the remainder is to be paid by Bills of Exchange within two Months. He made a Present of the Czar's picture set with Diamonds, to the value of One thousand Crowns, to each of the two Deputies of the Council that treated with him. On the 21st the Prince march'd away with the Muffcovite Troops, part of which are to go into Pomerania, and the rest to be transported to Finland, where the Czar will carry on the War without any loss of Forty thousand Men. The Czar was oblig'd by virtue of his Alliance with the King of Denmark, to furnish him with Eight thousand Men; Prince Menzikoff at first, made some Difficulties about them,
