Majesty, upon the bappy Conclusion of a long-ex-pected and defired Peace. And we shall gladly embrace all Opportunities to Demonstrate the profoundest Duty and Loyalty to Tour Sacred Person and Government, and Zeal for the Protestant Succession in the most Illustrious House of Hanover.
