

from the French Camp at Spire confirm the opening | of the Trenches before Landau on the 24th past at Night, and report, that the Approaches advanced with Success the three following Nights. We are affured by Accounts from Prince Eugene's Camp at Mulberg, that the Imperial Army confilts but of One hundred forty four Squadrons and Sixty Battalions, besides the Troops lest in Garrison; which Force is only fufficient to hinder the French from passing the Rhine.

Utrecht, July 13. N. S. Yesterday the Earl of Strafford return'd from the Hague. Soon after the Ministers of Spain had a Conference with those of Her Majesty, in which it was agreed, at the desire of the former, to defer Signing the Treaty of Peace between Her Majesty and the King of Spain, till this Afternoon. It was fign'd about seven of the Clock, as was likewise that between his Catholick Majesty and the Duke of Savoy an hour after.

Hague; July 14. N S. The Deputies of Brabant and Flanders are return'd from Utrecht, where they had been for some time, in order to Regulate the Trade of those Provinces. On the 11th the Earl of Strafford acquainted the Grand P of onary that he was going to Utrecht to fign the Treaty of Peace between Her Majesty and the King of Sp i . Accordingly he fet out the next No ning for that Place, and is expected back before the 18th, which being the Day appointed by Her Majesty for a General Thanksgiving for the Peace great Prepara-tions are making by his Excellency for an Enter-tainment and a Masquerade on that Occasion. This Morning we received Advice, that the Treaty of Peace between Great Britain and Spain was fign'd Yesterday in the Evening, as was likewise that between Spain and Savoy.
