Proposed Road Traffic Orders: Liverpool Road/Water Street/Quay Street/ Woollam Place, City Centre

Notice is hereby given that the Manchester City Council propose to make Orders under sections 1 and 2 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. The Orders and their effect are as follows:

- (a) Parking Places and Controlled Parking Zone (Manchester) Order 1971 (Variation) Order No. 81, 1988.
 - (i) To prohibit waiting at any time on:
 - Water Street, North-west side, between the North-eastern kerb-line of New Quay Street and the northern kerbline of Regent Road.
 - South-east side, between the north-eastern kerb-line of New Quay Street and the north-east kerb-line of Dawson Street.
 - Liverpool Road, North side, from the south-easterly kerbline of Water Street for a distance of 131 metres in a south-easterly direction. South side, from the southeasterly kerb-line of Water Street to the northwesterly kerb-line of Potato Wharf.
 - Quay Street, South-west side, between Deasngate and a point of 103 metres south-east of the south-eastern kerb-line of Water Street.
 - (ii) To prohibit waiting between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on Monday to Friday and between the hours of 8 a.m. and 12.30 p.m. on Saturday on:
 - Liverpool Road. North side, between a point 25.5 metres north-west of Deansgate and a point 131 metres south-east of the south-easterly kerb-line of Water Street.
 - South side, between the western kerb-line of Collier Street and the north-westerly kerb-line of Potato Wharf.
 - Woollam Place, both sides (including the cul-de-sac end).
 - Quay Street, south-west side, from the south-eastern kerbline of Water Street for a distance of 103 metres in a south-easterly direction.
 - (iii) To remove two parking meter bays on the south-west side of Quay Street.
- (b) City of Manchester (Water Street, Manchester) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1988

To prohibit waiting at any time on:

Water Street the cul-de-sac end extending from the southwesterly kerb-line of Regent Road on both sides in a south-westerly direction up to and including the culde-sac end.

Exemptions are included in the proposed waiting restrictions for purposes of boarding or alighting, loading/unloading, funerals. building operations or works on or under the lengths of road. The statutory exemption for disabled persons' vehicles is included in the Orders.
