

3. The prohibition referred to in paragraph 2(b) above would not apply in relation to anything done:

- (a) with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform; or
- (b) in accordance with any restriction or requirement indicated by traffic signs placed on the highway by or on behalf of the Metropolitan Police.

4. A copy of the proposed Order, of the above-mentioned regulations of 1965 and of the Council's statement of reasons for proposing to make the Order can be inspected between 9 a.m. and 4 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays, inclusive, in the offices of the Director of Technical Services, 25 Nelson Street, East Ham, London E6 4EH, until the expiration of a period of 21 days from the date on which this notice is published. OLDHAM COUNTRY COUNCIL

The Oldham (Lancashire County Council) (Central Area of Shaw Crompton) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1965 (Amendment) Order 1988

The Oldham (Central Area of Shaw Crompton) Traffic Regulation Order 1988

The Oldham (Westway Shaw) (Restriction of Waiting) Order 1988

Notice is hereby given that the Oldham Borough Council propose to make Orders under sections 1(1) and (2) and 2(1) to (3) and 4(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Act, the effect of which will be to (i) prohibit waiting at any time on any of the sides of lengths of roads specified in Schedule 1 to this notice, (ii) prohibit waiting between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. Mondays to Saturdays inclusive on any of the sides of lengths of roads specified in Schedule 2, (iii) impose one-way traffic in the lengths of roads specified in Schedule 3, and (iv) prohibit waiting (except by vehicles displaying a valid permit issued by the Council) between 7 a.m. and 6 p.m. on Thursdays in the length of road specified in Schedule 4.

It is also proposed that The Lancashire County Council (Central Area of Shaw Crompton) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1965 be amended by the removal of waiting restrictions between 7 a.m. and 6 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive in the lengths of roads specified in Schedule 5.

The Greater Manchester County (Kershaw Street Shaw) Restriction of Waiting (Borough) Order 1982 and The Greater Manchester County (Queen Street Shaw) Restriction of Waiting (Borough) Order 1983 will also be revoked.

Exemptions (Schedules 1 and 2)

- (a) To enable people to board or alight from a vehicle.
- (b) To enable goods to be loaded onto or unloaded from a vehicle.
- (c) Vehicles used for building or demolition operations, funerals, weddings, roadworks, works on sewers or statutory undertakers equipment.
- (d) Vehicles used in pursuance of statutory powers and duties.
- (e) Disabled persons vehicles for up to 2 hours, return prohibited within 1 hour.

Full details of the proposal are in the draft Orders which, together with maps showing the lengths of roads referred to and a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Orders, may be examined at my office between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. Mondays to Fridays (Room 447, telephone 061-678 4711).

Any objections or representations regarding the proposal should be sent to the Director of Legal and Secretarial Services, Civic Centre, Oldham OL1 1UL, in writing, stating the title of the Order to which they relate and the grounds for making them by 29th July 1988.

SCHEDULE 1

No waiting at any time

Lengths of roads at Shaw in the Borough of Oldham

Queen Street, both sides, extending from its junction with High Street for a distance of 15 metres in a southerly direction.

High Street, south side, extending from a point 20 metres west of its junction with Queen Street to a point 15 metres east of that junction.

High Street, north side, extending from a point 50 metres west of its junction with Westway to a point 15 metres east of that junction.

Westway, west side, extending from a point 15 metres south of its junction with Farrow Street to its junction with Rochdale Road.

Westway, east side, extending from a point 15 metres south of its junction with Farrow Street to a point 15 metres north of that junction.

Westway, east side, extending from a point 87 metres north of its junction with Farrow Street to its junction with Rochdale Road.

Westway, both sides, extending from its junction with High Street for a distance of 15 metres in a northerly direction.

Farrow Street, both sides, extending from a point 15 metres west of its junction with Westway to a point 15 metres east of that junction.

Kershaw Street, both sides, extending from its junction with Westway to a point 5 metres west of its junction with Collinge Street.

SCHEDULE 2

No waiting 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday to Saturday inclusive

Lengths of roads at Shaw in the Borough of Oldham

High Street, both sides, extending from a point 15 metres east of its junction with Queen Street to its junction with Refuge Street.

Farrow Street, both sides, extending from a point 15 metres east of its junction with Westway to its junction with Market Street.

Kershaw Street, both sides, extending from a point 5 metres west of its junction with Collinge Street to its junction with Regent Street.

SCHEDULE 3

One-way traffic

Lengths of roads at Shaw in the Borough of Oldham

Westway, extending from its junction with High Street to its junction with Rochdale Road in a north-easterly direction.

Collinge Street, extending from its junction with Rochdale Road to its junction with Kershaw Street in a south-westerly direction.

SCHEDULE 4

No waiting (except by permitted vehicles) on Thursdays between 7 a.m. and 6 p.m.

Westway, east side, extending from a point 15 metres north of its junction with Farrow Street for a distance of 72 metres in a northerly direction.
