TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING GENERAL REGULATIONS 1976

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he has made an Order entitled "The Conversion of Highways into Footpaths or Bridleways (County Borough of West Bromwich) (No. 1) Order 1974 (Variation) Order 1988". The Order comes into operation on 8th July 1988 and will reduce the length of the pedestrian area on High Street, West Bromwich, and permit the use of special electrically operated vehicles provided by or on behalf of the applicant authority for the conveyance of disabled persons within that area.

Copies of the variation Order and the 1974 Order and deposited plan may be obtained, free of charge, by applying to the office of the Director (Transport), West Midlands Regional Office, Department of Transport, No. 5 Broadway, Broad Street, Birmingham B15 1BL (quoting ref. WMT 5107/41/17/1), and may be inspected at all reasonable hours at the offices of Sandwell Metropolitan Borough Council, Town Clerk and Chief Executive's Department, Town Hall, West Bromwich, Sandwell B70 8DX.

If any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question its validity or the validity of any provision contained in it, on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the above Act or that any requirement of that Act or of any regulations made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, he or she may, within 6 weeks from 8th July 1988, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained in it.

Unless the Order is suspended or quashed as a consequence of any such application, any person who on 8th July 1988 has an interest in land having lawful access to a highway to which the Order relates may claim to be entitled to be compensated by the Sandwell Metropolitan Borough Council in respect of any depreciation in the value of his or her interest which is directly attributable to the Order and of any other loss or damage which is so attributable. Any claim must be served on the Council at its above address within a period of 6 months from 8th July 1988, unless the period is extended in any particular case by the Secretary of State.

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that on the application of the Canterbury City Council, he proposes to make an Order under section 212 of the above Act to provide for the extinguishment of any right which persons may have to use vehicles on part of Clyde Street from its junction with Notley Street south-westwards for a distance of 28 metres at Canterbury in the county of Kent.

RSE/5062/24/2/01), at the address of the office of the Director (Transport), Departments of the Environment and Transport, South East Regional Office, Federated House, London Road, Dorking, Surrey RH4 1SZ, object to the making of the Order.
