MIDDLESBROUGH BOROUGH COUNCIL

Middlesbrough Borough Council (Southwell Road) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1988

Notice is hereby given that Middlesbrough Borough Council acting as agents for Cleveland County Council propose to make an Order under the provision of section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The effect of the Order is that no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a traffic warden be allowed to leave their vehicle at any time on the west side of Southwell Road from its junction with Eastbourne Road for a distance of 30 metres in a northerly direction.

Exceptions will permit waiting for the purposes of:

- (a) picking up and setting down passengers,
(b) loading onto or unloading goods from the vehicle provided that no vehicle shall wait for more than 20 minutes for such a purpose except upon the direction or with the permission of a police officer in uniform or of a traffic warden,

and where necessary in connection with:

- (c) maintenance of the roads,
(d) the supply of gas, electricity and water,
(e) the delivery or collection of postal packages,
(f) any fire brigade, ambulance or police purpose.

There is the usual 2-hour exemption for disabled persons' vehicles.

Full details are contained in the draft Order which together with a plan showing the restricted area and a statement of the Council's reasons for making the Order may be examined free of charge during the hours of 9 a.m. to 4.30 p.m. Monday to Friday inclusive.
