Lisbon, July 18. N. S. This Court hath agreed with that of Spain, to prolong the Suspension of Arms, which expir'd on the 15th Instant, till a Treaty of Peace is Sign'd by their Plenlpotentiaries at Utrecht. This is thought to be in fo great forwardness, that Preparations are making for Re-joycings upon that Occasion, and on the 1st of Sep-tember there is to be a Feast of Bulls. Her Majefty's Ship the Fox, which has waited in this Har-hour for fome time, expecting the arrival of Sir Ni-cholas Trevanian, intends to fet Sail for Great Britain without him, if he does not come in here within two Days. We have receiv'd advice from Cadiz, that Captain Paddon was arrived there, having concluded a Truce with the Emperor of Morocco for three Months.

Hamburg, July 28. N. S. Since the Swedifh Mi-nifters are not able to perform their Agreement about the delivery of Stetin to the King of Pruffia, by reason of the obstinate refutat of Monsieur Meyerfeldt, the Governor, to do it without an ex-preis Order from the King his Master, the Muscovite and Saxon Troops have invested that Place on every fide, and intend to befiege it in Form, in or-der to deliver it into the Hands of his Pruffian Majesty, who it is faid will contribute whatever is wanting, for the Success of that Enterprize. The Allies hope to be Mafters of the Town in three Weeks, from the opening of the Trenches, and Geheral Baver has already taken by Storm one of the Forts nam'd the Star. The Garrison confifts of Five thouland Men, and if they were sufficiently pro-vided with Necessfaries, they would be capable of making a long and vigorous Refistance. The King of Denmark intended to leave Copenhagen this Day, and his Majefty is expected at Gottorp on the 2d of next Month. He hath order'd Eleven thoufand Men to march out of Zeland into Holftein, and refolves to form an Army there of Thirty thoufand Men of his own Troops, including those that are upon their return from Flanders.
