CLEAN AIR ACT 1956

The Brayton Smoke Control Order 1988

Notice is hereby given that the district council of Selby, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 11 of the above-mentioned Act, as amended by section 1 and Schedule 2 of the Local Government, Planning and Land Act 1980, proposed on 7th July 1988, to make an Order entitled Brayton Smoke Control Order 1988, declaring the area described in the Schedule hereto to be made a smoke control area.

Subject to the exemptions provided by the Order and by virtue of section 11(4) of the Clean Air Act 1956, if, on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the Smoke Control Order area, the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £400 unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

Subject to the provisions of section 9 of the Clean Air Act 1968, any person who acquires for use in a smoke control area any solid fuel other than an authorised fuel shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £400.

If made, the Order will come into operation on 1st September 1989, or at a later date determined by Selby District Council.

Copies of the draft Order and the map referred to therein may be inspected free of charge at the Civic Centre, Portholme Road, Selby, at all reasonable times during the period of 6 weeks from 21st July 1988.

Within the said period any person who will be affected by the Order may, by notice in writing to J. C. Edwards, B.A. (Hons.), Chief Executive and Clerk of the Council, Selby District Council, Civic Centre, Portholme Road, Selby YO8 0SB, object to the making of the Order.

SCHEDULE

Description of Area

That part of the Parish of Brayton not within the areas of Selby (Nos. 1 and 2) Smoke Control Orders 1980 and 1982.

Commencing at a point south-east of Burton Hall the southern boundary of the Smoke Control Order area follows the parish boundary of Brayton Parish in an easterly direction along the southern bank of Selby Canal to the A19. It then continues along the Parish boundary crossing Henwick Hall Lane and the Selby, Doncaster railway line, continuing in an easterly direction until it

turns north along the Brayton Parish boundary to Bawtry Road (A1041), it continues in a north-westerly direction along Bawtry Road until it turns north-east along Thief Lane. The boundary then turns north-westerly cutting across fields following the parish boundary back to Bawtry Road. At Bawtry Road the Smoke Control Order area boundary turns south and follows the centre of the Bawtry Road to its junction with Brayton Lane, the boundary then turns west along Brayton Lane to its junction with Baffam Lane. The boundary then turns north along Baffam Lane to its junction with Doncaster Road, then south-westerly along Doncaster Road to the junction of Fox Hill Lane. The boundary turns north-west along Fox Hill Lane and continues to the junction of Brackenhill Lane. It then follows Brackenhill Lane to Sandhill Gates. At Sandhill Gates the boundary crosses the Leeds, Selby railway line and turns west along the northern boundary of the railway, turning north, along the boundary to the rear of the properties on the west side of Sandhill Lane.

When the Smoke Control Order boundary meets Leeds Road it then follows Leeds Road west. Midway between Halfway House and Sandhill Lane, the boundary turns north to Selby Dam, it follows Selby Dam west until it meets Thorpe Willoughby Parish boundary, then turns south. It continues in a southerly direction across Leeds Road, (A63) and the Leeds, Selby railway line, continuing in a southerly direction across Barff Lane and through Brayton Barff, following the line of Brayton Parish boundary, and then crossing Mill Lane and Selby Canal.

Henwick Hall Lane: That part within Brayton Parish.

Leeds Road: Half Way House.

Mill Lane: That part within Brayton Parish.

Thief Lane: That part within Brayton Parish.
