All Saints Road, north-east side, from its junction with Broadway Street for a distance of 15 metres in a south-easterly direction.

All Saints Road, north-east side from its junction with Broadway Street for a distance of 15 metres in a north-westerly direction. All Saints Road, south-west side, from its junction with Broadway

Street for a distance of 15 metres in a south-easterly direction.

All Saints Road, south-west side, from its junction with South

Broadway Street for a distance of 15 metres in a north-westerly

direction.

Kitling Greaves Lane, south side, from its junction with Tutbury Road for a distance of 8 metres in a westerly direction.

Kitling Greaves Lane, north side, from its junction with Tutbury Road for a distance of 15 metres in a westerly direction.

Eldon Street, both sides, from its junction with Church Hill Street for a distance of 15 metres in a south-easterly direction.

- (ii) No waiting between 8 a.m. and 7 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive
- All Saints Road, north-west side, from a point 15 metres from its junction with Broadway Street for a distance of 35 metres in a north-westerly direction.
- All Saints Road, south-west side, from a point 15 metres from its junction with South Broadway Street for a distance of 35 metres in a north-westerly direction.
- (iii) Waiting for 1 hour in 2 hours between 8 a.m. and 7 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive.
- Lichfield Street, south-east side, from a point 15 metres from its junction with St. Peter's Bridge to its junction with Bond Street for a distance of 120 metres in a north-easterly direction.

- Lichfield Street, north-west side, from a point 15 metres from its junction with Orchard Street for a distance of 96 metres in a north-easterly direction.
- (b) The Proposed East Staffordshire District Council (Winshill, Burton-upon-Trent) (Weight Restriction) Order 1988.

To effect a weight limit on Newton Road (B5008), Burton-upon-Trent, from its junction with Ashby Road to its junction with the Derbyshire County Council boundary by imposing the prohibition (except for access) of goods vehicles exceeding 7.5 tonnes maximum gross weight on all roads in Winshill, Burton-upon-Trent.

(e) The Proposed East Staffordshire District Council (Borough Road Gyratory System) (Various Roads, Burton-upon-Trent One-way Traffic and Bus Lane) (Amendment No. 1) Order 1988.

To amend the East Staffordshire District Council (Borough Road Gyratory System) (Various Roads, Burton-upon-Trent One-way Traffic and Bus Lane) Order 1987 to provide for the use of the bus lane at King Edward Place by emergency services vehicles.
