MID GLAMORGAN COUNTY COUNCIL

The Mid Glamorgan County Council (Dunraven Street, Aberkenfig) (Revocation) and (Prohibition and Limitation of Waiting) Order 1988

Notice is hereby given that on 18th July 1988, the Mid Glamorgan County Council made an Order under sections 1, 2 and 4 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which is:

- (i) To revoke the "Mid Glamorgan County Council (Dunraven Street (B4281) Aberkenfig) (Revocation, Prohibition and Limitation of Waiting) Order 1977.
- (ii) To prohibit the waiting of vehicles at any time on both sides of Dunraven Street (B4281) Aberkenfig from its junction with Bridgend Road (A4063) westwards to the common boundary of Nos. 6 and 8 Dunraven Street, a distance of approximately 51 metres (56 yards).
- (iii) To prohibit the waiting of vehicles between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. Monday to Saturday inclusive on the northern and north-western side of Dunraven Street, Aberkenfig, from a point opposite the common boundary of Nos. 6 and 8 Dunraven Street, westwards and south-westwards to a point opposite the southern boundary of No. 54 Dunraven Street, a distance of approximately 190 metres (208 yards).

Exemptions are provided in the Order to enable medical practitioners and veterinary surgeons to visit while "on call" and for the purposes of boarding, alighting, loading and unloading, building and road works, the maintenance, improvement, reconstruction, inspection or survey of the sides of lengths of road, the maintenance of essential services, weddings, funerals and the delivery or collection of postal packets by vehicles in the service of the Post Office. Disabled persons' vehicles displaying the relevant disabled person's badge will be allowed to wait for up to 2 hours with return prohibited within 1 hour.

The Order came into operation on 21st July 1988 and a copy thereof and a map showing the sides of length of road to which the Order relates may be inspected at the Offices of the Mid Glamorgan County Council, Cathays Park, Cardiff, during normal office hours until the end of 6 weeks from 21st July 1988.

Any person wishing to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any Instrument made
