WANSDYKE DISTRICT COUNCIL

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971, SECTION 277

Conservation Area

Notice is hereby given that on 11th May 1988, the Wansdyke District Council, being a Local Planning Authority as defined in section 277(10) of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, determined that the area known as Pensford (more particularly described below) being an area of special architectural or historical interest the character and appearance of which it is desirable to preserve, be designated as a Conservation Area under section 277 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971.

The aforementioned Conservation Area, known as Pensford, shall contain the buildings fronting on to the west side of the A37 (Pensford Hill) from the Methodist Church down to the Bridge, Church Street, the church and both banks of the stream below the viaduct, including the weir. The area south of the River Chew, including Mill Stream Cottage, Guy's Farm, the frontages on to Wick Lane up to Rose Cottage, Salters Brook and all properties fronting on to the west of the A37 (New Road) back to Penswood Bridge shall also be included in the Conservation Areas will the area east of the main road (Pensford Hill) including all the properties lying between the Old Bakery, the river and Pensford Bridge, the County Primary School being amongst them. East of Pensford Bridge the Conservation Area shall include the buildings fronting the High Street from the junction with the A37 (New Road) up to the Old School House and also those standing north of the High Street surrounding the former Chapel Barton site, The Spangles and lock up opposite.

The Conservation Area, as described above, is shown as the area edged black on map No. C2 which may be inspected during normal office hours Mondays to Fridays at the Town Hall, Keynsham or the Council Offices, The Hollies, Midsomer Norton.

The effects of this designation are as follows:

- (1) No buildings in the above-mentioned Conservation Area shall be demolished without the consent of the Local Planning Authority, unless specifically exempted by the Secretary of State.
- (2) It shall be an offence to cut down, top, lop, uproot, wilfully damage, or wilfully destroy any tree in the area except with the consent of the Local Planning Authority.

HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

The County Council of Clwyd (A525 Wrexham to Whitchurch Principal Road, Improvement of Kingsmills Road and Salop Road, Wrexham) (Side Roads) Order 1988.

Notice is hereby given that the County Council of Clwyd hereby gives notice that it has made, and submitted to the Secretary of State for Wales for confirmation, an Order under sections 14 and 125 of the Highways Act 1980, for authorising the Council:

- (a) to improve, raise, lower or otherwise alter highways,
