Six thousand Men were appointed to conduct the King of Sweden through Poland 16 Dantzick, but his Majefty not thinking that a fufficient Convoy, refus'd to go with them, upon which the Turks threatned to fend him to fome other Place,

in cafe he did not comply very fcon. Madrid, July 24. N. S. This Day the Count de Montico arrived here with the Treaty of Peace, which was Sign'd at Utrecht on the 13th Inftant, between Great Britain and Spain. Some Days ago the Genoele Envoy made his Publick Entry, and had his first Audience, with the Ceremonies, that have been lately regulated by this Court, and which all other Envoys are to tollow. The Duke de Fei-nandina is banih'd this City for Ten Years, for having committed a Murther at Villa Franca. The Prince Robeck is made a Grandce of the first Clais. The Government of Peru is committed to the Alcobifliop of Linia, during the absence of the Prince de Santobueno the Vice Roy, who intends to take the next opportunity of embarking for that Kingdom. I he Merchant Ships bound thither having already fet Sail, they are to be Convoy'd by Two Brit'sh Men of War as far as the Canary Iilands, for fear of the Algerine Privateers, which continue to infêît those Seas. Letters from Catalonia bring an ac-count, that the Marquis de Leedas had taken poffession of Terragona on the 13th; the Miquelets had thut up the Passages of the Mountains, purjuant to a Refolution taken by the Catalans, to delend themselves against France and Spains notwithftanding which, it is thought they will make their Submittion as foon as the King's Army approaches Barcelona.

Hamburg, August 1. N. S. We have received Advice, that the Elector of Hanover has affured the King of Pruffia he will concur with any Meafures his Majefty shall think fit to take to encline the King of Denmark to evacuate Holtlein, provided an exact Neutrality be observed between the Princes engaged in the War. The Conferences at Berlin known in this matter. Prince Menzikoff is gone to Stetin, to haften the Attack of that Place by his Prefence. The Siege is be carried on by Twenty five thousand Muscovites, who only wait for the arrival of the Saxon Artillery to open the Trenches. General Meyerfeldt is made a Count, Governor of Pomerania, and one of the King's Counfellors. Monfieur Ducker is conftituted General of the Horfe, and Commander in Chief of the Swedish Forces in Germany.

Utrecht, Aug. 4. N. S. The Prince of Naflau-Siegen, who has been here during the Congress to follicit his Pretenfions to the Principality of Orange, was Arrefted fome Days ago for Debt. Upon which all the Ministers affembled Yesterday at the Lord Privy Seal's House, to confider of that Matter, and it appear'd to them that the Prince has a Voice and Seffion in the College of the Princes of the Empire, and by vertue thereof a right to fend Ministers, who are entituled to the fame Security and Immunities as those of other Princes at this Congress, and confequently that the faid Prince being here in Perfon, ought to enjoy the fame Security and Im-munities. Whereupon it was unanimoufly refolv'd not only to reclaim him, and to demand that he be forthwith fet at Liberty, but alfo that due Satif-faction be made him for the Affront he had re-ceived. Accordingly the faid Ministers delivered a Representation to the Magistrates of this City to that purpose. This Day the Magistrates, after mature Deliberation, agreed unanimoully, that the Prince be fet at Liberty, and Reparation made for the Wrong done him. The Duke d'Offuna and the Marquis de Monteleon, Ministers of Spain, are gone from hence to the Hague.
