(d) disabled persons' vehicles;

and where necessary in connection with:

- (e) the maintenance of the road;
- (f) supply of gas, electricity and water;
- (g) delivery and collection of postal packets.

The Order will come into effect on 1st August 1988.

A copy of the Order, an explanatory statement and maps showing the lengths of roads concerned may be inspected during normal office hours at the Borough Secretary's Department at the address given below.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order, or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or any requirement of Part II of Schedule 9 to the Order has not been complied with you may do so by application to the High Court within 6 weeks of the date of publication of this notice.
