  - (b) a road approximately 520 metres in length slightly to the north of the existing trunk road, starting from a point 1.52 kilometres east of Mill Road and rejoining the trunk road at a point 710 metres west of the western side of Longthorpe Interchange (between these two highways, the existing trunk road will be improved); and
  - (c) two slip roads to connect the carriageways of the improved trunk road with a new highway which will be a diversion of Marholm Road in the vicinity of Milton Park.
- (2) An Order under sections 10 and 12 of the Highways Act 1980, the effect of which is to provide that the lengths of the A47 trunk road specified in the Schedule to the Order entitled "The A47 Trunk Road (De-trunking at Castor and Ailsworth) Order 1988" to be superseded by the new trunk roads mentioned above shall cease to be trunk road and shall be classified as classified road, as from the date on which the Secretary of State notifies the County Council of Cambridgeshire (who will become the highway authority responsible for those lengths) that the said new trunk roads are open for through traffic.
- (3) An Order under sections 12, 14 and 125 of the Highways Act 1980, the effect of which is to authorise him:
  - (a) to carry out the improvement of highways,
  - (b) to stop up highways,
  - (c) to construct new highways,

(d) to stop up private means of access to premises, and

(e) to provide new means of access to premises,

all at Castor and Ailsworth aforesaid, and to provide for the transfer of each of the said new highways to the County Council of Cambridgeshire as from the date on which he notifies that authority that the new highway is open to through traffic.
