Venice, August 11. N. S. The Great Chancellor Signor Pietro Bulinello, dy'd Yesterday, after a very short Indisposition, and the Senate have elected Signor Nicolosi, one of the chief Secretaries, to succeed him in that Employment. The Procurator Ruzzini, Ambaffador from the Republick to the States General, is recall'd. The Imperial Troops defigned for the Rhine, are país'd quite through the Veronese; and those that came lately into the Mantuan from Final, are now upon their March towards Tirol. Letters from Rome bring an Ac-count, that the Congregation of Health had made feyeral strict Orders to prevent the Plague, which is faid to be at Vienna, from spreading into the Ecclefiaflical Territories. A fecond Monitorio had been posted up against the Ministers of the Duke of Savoy, in which the Cenfures of the first are confirm'd, the Secular Power condemn'd, and those who have offended against the Ecclessafical Immunities, are threatned to be proceeded against by a formal Excommunication, according to the Cartons, without any regard to Perfons of the higheft Rank or Dignity. As the Edist of the Court of Turin, declaring the first Monitorio to be of no force, is fign'd by his Royal Highnefs, who has also rejected the Proposals that have been made for an Accommodation, it is thought this Affair will produce very great Confequences. The Difputes produce very great Confequences. with the Republick of Genoa likewife grow much warmer, and the Pope infifts that the Friar Granelli flould come to Rome, and fubmit to his Mercy. A Congregation had been held upon the Differences between the Biffrop of Lece, and the Civil Power of Nzples, and the Bifhop's Conduct was difapprov'd of.

Vienne, August 12. N. S. Some Days ago it was refolved at a Meeting of the Imperial Minifters, to forbid all Communication between Auftria and other Parts of his Majesty's Dominions that are free from any Infection, and to appoint Places on the Frontiers, where all Paffengers fhould perform a Quarentine. This Refolution was approved by the Emperor, and notice has been given for those who have a mind to withdraw from hence to do it within three Days, after which the Paffages will be fhut up. It is thought their Imperial Majeflies will go very foon to the Caftle of Eberfdorff, in order to refide there, while the Contagious Diftempers continue in this City. Letters from Confantinople bring an Account, that a Fire had broke, out there, which had burnt down a great number of Houles,
