# **NEW TOWNS ACT 1981**

The New Town of Telford: Extinguishment of Public Right of Way over part of Wesley Road, Ironbridge, Telford.

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for the Environment, in exercise of his powers under section 23 of the New Towns Act 1981, proposes to make an Order extinguishing the public rights of way over the following route, shown in black on the map hereinafter referred to:

That part of Wesley Road starting from a point marked B on the map (located approximately 22 metres west of its junction with Madeley Hill) and running in an easterly direction for a distance of 4 metres to a point marked C on the map.

The proposed Order will not extinguish the public rights of way over the footway on the southern side of Wesley Road.

A map showing the rights of way proposed to be extinguished may be inspected at the offices of the Telford Development Corporation, Priorslee Hall, Telford, Shropshire TF2 9NT, and at the offices of the Ironbridge Gorge Museum Trust, The Wharfage, Ironbridge, during normal office hours. Stopping-up of Part of a Highway at Offerton, Stockport
