If any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question its validity or the validity of any provision contained in it, on the ground that it is not within the powers conferred by the above Act or that any requirement of that Act or of any regulation made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, he or she may, within 6 weeks from 3rd November 1988, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained in it.

Unless the Order is suspended or quashed as a consequence of any such application, any person who on 3rd November 1988 has an interest in land having lawful access to a highway to which the Order relates may claim to be entitled to be compensated by the Cannock Chase District Council in respect of any depreciation in the value of his or her interest which is directly attributable to the Order and of any other loss or damage which is so attributable.
