Stopping-up of a Highway

Notice is hereby given, that the Council of the Borough of Hartlepool as agent for and on behalf of Cleveland County Council, (the Highway Authority), intends to apply to the Magistrates' Court sitting at the Law Courts, Civic Centre, Victoria Road, Hartlepool, Cleveland, on Tuesday, 20th December 1988, at 3 p.m. for an Order pursuant to section 116 of the Highways Act 1980, that the length of highway referred to in the Schedule hereto to be stopped-up on the ground that it is unnecessary.

SCHEDULE

Highway adjacent to Morison Memorial Hall, Hartlepool

That part of the highway running adjacent to Morison Memorial Hall and The Rectory from its junction with Church Close in a northerly direction for a distance of approximately 23 metres.

SCHEDULE

Fraser Grove, Hartlepool, Cleveland

That length of Fraser Grove being that part 1.2m wide of the footway (north side) running parallel with the kerbline and 1.8m to the north thereof and commencing at its junction with Eskdale Road and running for a distance of approximately 75 metres in a generally Westerly direction and then immediately adjacent to the carriageway in a generally northerly direction for a distance of approximately 7 metres.
