SCHEDULE

An area of approximately 180 hectares situated in that part of the Metropolitan District known as Normanton.

Bounded on the northerly side by a line drawn down the centre of Newlands Lane at a point opposite the eastern end of St. Johns R. C. Church proceeding in an easterly direction along Newlands Lane to its junction with Wakefield Road (the A655), then for a short distance south along Wakefield Road to its junction with Church Lane. Bounded on the southerly side by a line following in a south westerly direction along the constituency boundary from its junction with Beckbridge Lane to a point opposite No. 7 Hill Top View, then in a north westerly direction in a straight line to its junction with Wakefield Road (the A655) at a point opposite the rear boundary of No. 2 Sylvester Avenue.

Bounded on the westerly side by the centre line of Wakefield Road proceeding in a north-easterly direction from a point opposite the rear boundary of No. 2 Sylvester Avenue to a point opposite Haven Lodge Residential Home, along the southern and western boundary of Haven Lodge and the western boundary of the A1 Tyre Service premises. In a northerly direction to its intersection with the boundary of No. 242 Wakefield Road. The boundary line then proceeds in a westerly direction at the rear of Woodhouse Mount and encloses part of the Ellins Terrace allotment site, on its southern and western boundaries. The line proceeds in a westerly direction on the rear boundary of the rear access road from 32 Ellins Terrace to a point opposite No. 10 Ellins Terrace, then in a northerly direction to its junction with Newlands Lane.

Groyne Replacement Programme 1988-89

Notice is hereby given that the Christchurch Borough Council, acting in their capacity as coast protection authority, hereby give notice under subsection (1) of section 5 of the above Act, that they propose to carry out coast protection work as described below, on Mudeford Sandbank, Bournemouth, Dorset.

The works comprise the construction of two groynes in front of the existing sea wall and promenade on Mudeford Sandbank. The new structures will comprise block limestone and will be approximately 65 metres in length and 4 metres wide on the apex. The construction of the groynes will be accompanied by artificial nourishment of the beaches by naturally occurring gravel. The works will complete the Council's groyning strategy for Mudeford Sandbank and will protect the 1960's seawall and promenade, which is currently under constant attack by the sea. The estimated cost of the works is £186,000 and construction will commence in the autumn of 1989.
