Windsor, September 19.

THE following Adresses were presented to Her Majesty by his Grace the Duke of Ormond, Lord Lieutenant of the Kingdom of Ireland.

The humble Address of the High Sheriff, Justices of the Peace, Clergy, Grand Jury, Gentlemen, Freeholders, and others of the County of Monaghan, at the Assizes held for the said County.

Warsaw, Sept. 11. N. S. Most of the Saxon Troops are arrived in this Kingdom, and great Impositions have been laid on the People for their Subsistence. King Augustus hath deferr'd his Journey to Sendomir, upon some advice he has lately received from Adrianople, by which we are inform'd, that King Stanislaus was imprison'd for endeavouring to persuade the Turks that he had Letters from the Great Generals of Poland and Lithuania, assuring him that they would join him with their Troops under their Command, upon his first Appearance in this Country. The Palatin of Mazovia, our Ambassador at the Port, presented a Memorial, in which he complain'd of this Calumny rais'd against the Polish Generals, who were prepared for a vigorous Defence, in case any Invasion should be made on the Kingdom. He receiv'd a favourable Answer to his Representation, and was told, the Grand Signior would religiously observe his Treaties with the Republick, and only intended to Fortify Chocym in order to secure a Frontire on this Side, which was absolutely requisite in the present Conjuncture of his Affairs. The same Letters add, that the King of Sweden continued very much out of order, that he had a Gangrene in his Foot, for which it was found necessary to cut off two of his Toes.

Vienna, Sept. 9. N. S. On the 7th, the Queen of Portugal's Birth-Day was celebrated at Court with great Magnificence. The contagious Disease continues to rage here with great Violence, and the Persons to whose Care the Health of the People is committed, meet every Day to consider of proper Measures to prevent the Distemper from spreading.

It is already got into Bohemia, and the Mortality is very great at Prague. It prevails likewise in Franconia towards Nuremberg, as also at Ratisbonne, from whence the Ministers of the Diet have been oblig'd to remove. The Emperor has appointed Baron Lesselhotz to be Governor of Peter Varadin in the room of Baron Nehm, lately deceas'd. He is likewise constituted General of Sclavonia.

Berlin, Sept. 16. N. S. The King and Queen are expected from Weysterhausen on the 18th, and within a few Days after his Majesty intends to set out for Goltz, in order to take the Diversion of Stag Shooting. The Royal Regiment of Foot, and the Regiment of Anhalt, are upon their March to this Place, where they are to be in Garrison all next Winter. Advices from Hamburg bring an Account, that the Mortality encreases in that City, and the Number of Persons that died there last Week amounted to above Five hundred. The King of Denmark had for some time block'd up the City, under Pretence of preventing the Contagion from spreading, whereupon the Elector of Hanover sent Directions to his Resident here, to represent the ill Consequences of it to this Court, and to concert Measures with our Ministers to prevent any Design his Danish Majesty might have against that City: But we have been since informed, that the Danes have witherawn their Forces from thence.

Paris, September 22. N. S. The Court continues still at Fontainebleau, where his Majesty often takes the Diversion of Hunting and Fishing, and in the Evening of seeing a Comedy. An Express is lately arrived from Marschal Villars with an Account, that the Army under his Command, consisting of Two hundred and fifty Squadrons, and Two hundred and twenty five Battalions, passed the Rhine on the 12th at Fort Louis and Fort Kehl, and was encamped at Offenburg. It is not yet known what Design he may have in view, but we are assured he has full Power to act as he shall judge most convenient. The Detachment that was made from the Army under Marschal Bezons, has been replaced by Thirty six Battalions lately sent him, and he is now at the Head of One hundred Squadrons, and Sixty Battalions, without including Fifteen Regiments of Foot that are in Garrison at Landau. The Fortifications of that Place are entirely repaired; a great Quantity of Ammunition and Provisions has been sent into the Magazines there, and the Marquis de Vieux is left to Command in the Town. The King has bestowed the Government of Coutance upon Monsieur Blouin, one of the Grooms of the Bedchamber, with a yearly Salary of Twelve thousand Livres.

Hague, Sept. 26. N. S. The States General have presented the Marquis del Bourg, the Duke of Savoy's Minister, who has lately had an Audience of Leave, with a Gold Chain, and a Medal, and he is preparing for his Journey to Turin. On the 22d, the President of the Assembly of their High Mightinesses, return'd a Visit which he receiv'd the Day before from Monsieur de Chateauneuf, Ambassador
