From Mantona they write, that the Count de Waldestein is daily expected there, sent from the Emperor to assist at the Ratification of a Treaty of Marriage between the Duke of Mantona and the Princels of Guastala, to be present at the solemnity of the Marriage, and to endeavor to reconcile the Duke of Modena; who was formerly a pretender to the same Princels.

Cardinal Sforta may in little time be expected here from Ronie to visit the Estate which he has in

this Countrey.

Vienna, Octob. 9. Letters from Upper Hungary inform us, that many of the Robels who retited themfelves upon the advance of the Imperial Army into Transsistanta, are gone from thence to make their applications to the Grand Segnior, to defire his protection, having with them an Anyope from the Prince Abaffs, to oblique that Count on their behalf; but our advices from Belgreda, do not give us any cause of icalcusie, that the Turks have any inclinations to favour them, since they every where continue peaceable, not making any extraordinary preparations for war: the same Letters tell us, that the Countrey about Belgrade began to suffer much by a great dearth of Corn, the last Crop statectly affording them seed for the following year. The Deputies which were last dispatcht to Gracovy for the Regalia, in order to the Queens Coronation, are returned with all those Ornaments which are necessary for that solemnity, and were at their arrival met without this City with a great train of Coaches belonging to the King and the great persons of the Court, and about 50 Polish Lords on horseback, where the Regalia were taken into the Kings Coach, and conducted to the Kings Palace, where they were delivered by the Deputies with a Speech upon that occasion made first to the King, and then a 2d to the Queen, Great preparations are here making for her Majesties Coronation; the Count schaffgors is daily expected from Germany, who is to be present at the solemnity on the behalf of their Imperial Majesties.

The Primate is retired from the Court, suspecting the intentions of several great persons of the kingdom, but he has promised his Majesty to return again to assist at the Queens Coronation.

Haguer Octob. 29. The Deputies appointed by the States-General to take care for the strengthening of the fortifications of Maestricht, and making other necessary provisions for that place, carried with them Two Waggons laden with Money, and Letters of Exchange to be drawn upon the Merchants of Liege for the buying in a years provision of all sorts for that place, whither several Companies of Foot are ordered to march for the reinforcement of that Garrison, and divers others to the Forts upon the stondiers of Flanders, and upon the Relate.

Letters from Smirna of the 20th past tell us; that the Heer Van Dam, the Dutch Consul, intending to have passed by land from thence to Constantinople with his Nephew, and the Chancellor of that City, their servants and some Janisaries, were set uson by 25 Turkish Banditi, well horsed, who wounded divers of the company, and robbed them all; the Banditi being afterwards informed that they had done this violence to a Consul who would cause a severe industry to be made after them, returned again with an intention to have killed the whole company, but the Consul suspension that they had himself with most of his company in a Forest by which he was passing.

On Saturday last in the evening, a fire happened in Amsterdam, which burnt down Five houses, and might have done much more hurt, the wind being then very high, had not extraordinary care been used, and great assistance timely brought to extin-

guish it.

Barnstaple, Octob. 23. The great storms which still continue, have done much harm upon these coasts, and tis feared much more in other places. Two Dutch ships and one vessel belonging to Minhead are cast away in Bemde Bay; but all the men, one only excepted, are happily saved. Several pieces of ships with some Trunks and Chests, the evidences of some other wrecks, are driven on shoar 'about' Ilford-Comb.

London, Odob. 26. On Sunday the 23 instaur, in the Evening, the Marques Pucci, Envoye Extrapordinary from the Great Duke of Tuscany, accompanied by the Marques Capponi, and the Seignors Herini, Pucci, and Guadagni, had his Audience from their Majesties, and afterwards from Hix Royal' Highnes, introduced by Sir Charles Cotteres; Master

of the Ceremonies.

Munday the 24, the Two Houses of Parkinshehr, according to their Adjournment, Re-assembled at Westminster, where His Majesty being pleased to be present in the House of Lords, habited in His Royal Robes, the Crown upon His Head, He took His place, with the usual Ceremonies in the Chair of Estate, and the House of Commons, with their Speaker attending, His Majesty made a Gracious Speech to the Two Houses, leaving the Lord Keeper to open to them more at large the particulars; which ended, the Commons with their Speaker returned to their House, and the same morning adjourned, as did also the House of Lords till Thursday.
