A PROCLAMATION, For Proroguing the Parliament.

ANNE R.

W Hereas We have caufed Our Writs to be Isued VV for the Calling of a Parliament, to Meet and be Holden at Wellminster on Thursday the Twelfth Day of November next following, We, by the Advice of our Privy-Council, do bereby Publish and Declare, That the faid Parliament shall be Prorogued, on the faid Twelfth Day of November, to Thursday the Tenth Day of December next enfuing. And We bave given Order to Our Chancellor of Great Britain to prepare a Writ-Patent under Our Great Seal for Proroguing the same accordingly. And We do here-by further Declare, That convenient Notice shall be given by Proclamation of the Time when the said Parliament shall be Holden, and Sit for the Dispatch of Business, to the end that the Members of both Houses may order their Affairs accordingly.

A PROCLAMATION,

For Putting in Execution the Laws and Statutes of ling-Clay.

W Hereas many good Laws bave been made to Probibit and Prevent the Exportation 'of Wooll, Wooll-Fells, Mortlings or Shorlings, or any Tarn made of Wooll, or any Wooll-Flocks, or any Fuller's Earth, or Fulling-Clay what foever, out of the Kingdoms of Great Britain or Ireland, or out of the Isles of Jerley or Guernsey, with Sark and Alderney, into Foreign Parts, out of the Kingdoms or Isles aforefaid, under the several Penalties and Forfeitures in the faid Laws contained; In and by mbicb Laws feveral Encouragements are given to fuch Perfon or Perfons who fall. Sue or Inform for the fame : And thereby feveral Directions are given, as well for Guards on the Coafts, as for Entring and, Registring of Wooll, near the Sea-Coafts, for the better Preventing fueb Exportation, under feve-ral Penalties therein mentioned; yet neverthelefs the Exportation thereof is fill notorioufly Continued, to the great Discouragement and Prejudice of the Woollen Trade and Manafature of this Kingdom : We therefore, taking the same into Oar strious Con-fideration, and duly weighing the Evil Confequen-eas thereof to the Woollen Manufalture of this King-dom, by and with the Advise of Our Privy-Council, have thought fit to Mue this Our Royal Proclama-tion : And We do hereby, in purfuance of the faid Laws, firidly Charge, Probibit, and Command, That

Seas, contrary to the faid Laws : And that all the Laws and Statutes now in Force against the Exportation of the faid Commodities, he in every Particular punctually observed and kept, upon Pain of the severest Penalties, which by the Laws and Sta-tutes of this Realm may be inslided upon the Offenders themselves, their Aiders, Procurers, Abettors, or Favourers. And We do bereby Declare, That We will cause to be Effettually put in Execution the Laws and Statutes aforefaid; And that all Assistance and Encouragement shall be given by the Commillioners of our Cultoms, and other Our Officers, in the Recovery of the Rewards given by the faid Laws, to the Perfons who shall Discover and Sue for the same. And We do hereby stricty Charge and Command all Our Officers of the Cultoms, and others, who shall be any ways Imployed or Intrasted in the Difcovering, Profecuting, or Preventing the faid Offences, that they do use their utmost Diligence in the Discharge of their faid Trust, under the Pain of Incurring Our bighest Displeasure. And We do bereby strictly Charge and Command all Our Officers and Ministers to be Aiding and Assisting to the Officers of Our Customs, and others duly Authorized to put in Execution the faid Laws, and all others Alting in their Aid. And for the further Encouragement of all Perfons to be diligent to Dif-cover any of the Exporters of Wooll, contrary to the faid Laws, We do bereby Promife and Declare, That whofoever fhall Difcover any Perfon or Perfons who, fince the First Day of july last past, bath or bave Exported, or before the First Day of July now this Realm, for the Preventing the Exportation next enfuing, fail Export any Wooll contrary to the of Wooll, Wooll-Fells, Woollen-Yarn, Mortlings, faid Laws, fo as fuch Perfon or Perfons be brought Shorlings, Wooll-Flocks, Fuller's Earth, and Fulnext enfuing, fball Export any Wooll contrary to the Réwards already given by Alts of Parliament, the further Reward of Forty Pounds, whereof Our High Treasurer ù hereby Ordered to make Payment. And if any fuch Offender shall make such Discovery of any other of the said Offenders, so as he or they be brought to Justice, fuch Discoverer shall not only have Our Gracious Pardon for his said Offence, but shall have and receive the Reward hereby promised, as aforefaid.
