- (b) a pipe having a length of not more than 2 metres between the vessel referred to in sub-paragraph (a) above and the point where the pipe enters the building or other structure in which the gas is to be used.
- 3. This authorisation shall come into operation on 21st February 1989, and shall continue in force for a period of three years unless previously revoked by the Director General of Gas Supply after the expiration of a period of three months beginning with the publication or first publication of his intention to do so in the London Gazette and the Edinburgh Gazette.

NORTH BEDFORDSHIRE BOROUGH COUNCIL

North Bedfordshire Borough Council (Allhallows and Side Roads, Bedford) (Prohibition of Driving) Order 1989

Notice is hereby given that on 9th March 1989, the North Bedfordshire Borough Council acting as agents for the Bedfordshire County Council as highway authority, made a traffic regulation order under sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) to (3) and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, and of all other enabling powers, the effect of which will be to:

 - (c) North Bedfordshire Borough Council (Allhallows and Thurlow Street, Bedford) (Prohibition of Driving) Order 1979; (d) North Bedfordshire Borough Council (Allhallows,
 - (d) North Bedfordshire Borough Council (Allhallows, Bedford) (Cycle Parking Place) Order 1981. Insofar as they each apply to the roads mentioned in the Schedule to this notice.

Exemptions in the Order will allow access by vehicles for the following purposes:

- (iii) the delivery or collection by bullion vehicles or cash or securities to or from premises in the said roads;
- (iv) the delivery or collection of goods or the removal of furniture to or from premises in the said roads except between the hours 10.30 a.m. and 3.30 p.m. daily;
- (v) the delivery and collection of postal packets as defined in section 37 of the Post Office Act 1953;
- (vi) in connection with any funeral;
- (vii) obtaining access to or egress from designated cycle stands, provided the cycles are pushed by hand;
- (viii) for road cleansing or refuge collection;
- (ix) disabled persons vehicles displaying an orange badge for the purpose of obtaining access to or egress from the designated disabled parking spaces in Allhallows;
- (x) any other purpose authorised in writing by the Council.
