- (2) The Bath-Lincoln Trunk Road (Alcester By-passes A435/A422) Compulsory Purchase Order (Supplementary No. 2) (No. CM)19, notice of which was published on 25th January 1989 and on 1st February 1989. This Order is an Order under sections 239 and 240 of the Highways Act 1980 and under section 2 of the Acquisition of Land Act 1981 which if made, will authorise the Secretary of State to purchase compulsorily the land described therein for the purpose of:

(i) the construction of a highway in the parish of Alcester, in the district of Stratford-on-Avon, of in the county of Warwickshire in pursuance of the Side Roads Order referred to at (1) above:

(ii) use by the Secretary of State in connection with such construction of a highway.

(iii) mitigating any adverse effect which the existence or use of the new trunk roads proposed to be constructed or improved by him as referred to at (1) above will have on the surroundings thereof.
