

(1) South side from a point 13.5 metres east of its junction with High Street in an easterly direction to a point 13.5 metres west of its junction with Victoria Street and

(2) the south side for a distance of approximately 22 metres in a westerly direction from its junction with High Street.

Sleetmoor Lane—on the north side from its junction with High Street for a distance of 59 metres and from a point 26 metres east of the centre line of Warwick Road for a distance of 50 metres in a westerly direction. On the south side from its junction with High Street for a distance of 40 metres.

Warwick Road—on both sides for a distance of 10 metres from the channel line of Sleetmoor Lane.

Note. It will be necessary to revoke that part of The Derbyshire County Council (Nottingham Road, Somercotes Hill, and Victoria Street, Somercotes) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1978, in so far as it relates in Schedule 2—Part 1(c), Schedule 3—Part 3(a), to this Order and that part of The Derbyshire County Council (Various Streets, Somercotes, Alfreton) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 1975, in so far as it relates in Schedule 11—Sleetmoor Lane, to this Order.

Exemptions will be provided in the Order to enable vehicles to wait for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight from the vehicle; to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle; to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic; the maintenance of the roads or the services therein to take in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage situated within the lengths of road; or as part of a funeral or wedding cortege. The usual exemptions for disabled persons' vehicles will be provided in the Order.

Full details of the proposal are in the draft Order which, together with a map showing the prohibited areas and a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order may be examined at Room 108, County Offices, Matlock (I. Walters), during normal office hours 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday to Friday, and by appointment at Amber Valley District Council, Cornhill House, Nottingham Road, Alfreton.

If you wish to object to the proposed Order you should send the grounds for your objection in writing to the undersigned by Monday, 24th April 1989.

DERBYSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

Derbyshire County Council (Blind Lane, Wirksworth) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1988

Notice is hereby given that on 30th March 1989 the Derbyshire County Council made an Order under section 1(1) and (2), 2(1) to (3) and 4(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and of all other enabling powers.

When this Order comes into effect on 10th April 1989 you will not be allowed to leave your vehicle on the following lengths of road at Wirksworth:

No waiting at any time: Blind Lane

Both sides—from its junction with Coldwell Street for approximately 9 metres.

East side—from a point 80 metres south of its junction with Coldwell Street in a southerly direction for approximately 18 metres.

West side—from a point 80 metres south of its junction with Coldwell Street in a southerly direction for approximately 9 metres.

West side—from a point 98 metres south of its junction with Coldwell Street in a southerly direction for approximately 6 metres.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order, or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order you may, within 6 weeks from 31st March 1989, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

A copy of the Order and a map showing the length of road affected may be examined at Room 108, County Offices, Matlock (I. Walters), during normal office hours, i.e. Monday to Friday, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.
