



General. Monsieur Hespén being sent for by the Duke of Wirtemberg, his Master, is set out for that Court. We have received advice from the Upper Rhine, that the French being ready to make a general Assault upon Fribourg, the Governor had retired, with the Garrison, into the Castle, and desired a Truce for five Days, in order to know of Prince Eugene, whether he shall surrender the Castle upon the Terms offered him by Marschal Villars.
