Fenice，November 17．N．S．

ON the 15 th，Monfignor Mattei，the late Nuntio，fet out from hence，for his Arch－ bifhoprick of Fermo．Monfignor Aldobran－ dini，his Succeffor，hath notify＇d his arrival to the Senate，and is preparing to make his Publick Entry． Signor Andrea Memo，Ambaff dor to the Ottoman Port，wha fet Sail laft Week for Conftantinople，is arrived in Iftria，having efcaped a violent Storm that bath done a great deal of Damage in thefe Parts．A Veffel laden with Salt was calt away in the Port of Malamocco．Laft Night a Boat funk going to Padua with feveral Paflengers，but only two of them were drowned．They write from Rome，that the Pope was very much out of order， and had been obliged to leave the Imperial Ambar． fador in the middle of an Audience．The People of that City were reduced to great Mifery by the Mortality of Gattle，which had occafioned a great dearth of Provifions．Letters from Naples bring an account，that the Vice－Roy had publifyed a Proclanation，by order of the Emperor，forbid ing all Perfons from wearing Gold or Silver bromatios and foreign Silks，aby likewrile containing feveval Regulations for fhe beetsex puthing in execution the Sumptuary Latrs．Britilh Veffel was come in there from Meffina，and brought an àccount，that the King of Sicily＇s Troops had taken Pofieflion of all the Forts and Caftles in the whole 1 lland：Af－ ter which，the Spanifh Forces were ordered to leave the Kingdom inmediately．His Majefty had ta－ ken upan himfelf the Debts of the Bank，called Monte de Pieta，and had paid the Money lent by the Genoefe with Intereft．Admiral Jennings con－ tinued there on the 3 ift of Octoter．The Ambuif． cade＇，richly laden from London，was likewile ar－ rived at Naples．The Convoy，with fome of the Spanifh Troops defign＇d for Hungary，had fet Sail．

ceed to open Force，and that other Princes like－ wife made ule of that Pretence to declare againt him，he would take his Meafures accordingly，and frive to the utmot to repel any Violence that fhould be offer＇d to him．It is faid，the J＇ruffian Miniters are very much divided in their Opinions， whether it be convenient for the King to engage in 2 War．The Mufcovite Ambaffador hath repeated his Affurances to his Danifh Majefty，that the Czar will continue firm in his Alliance，and fecond him with his whole Force，in cafe he chould be attack＇d in Holfein．The King of Pruffia hath writ a very preffing Letter to the King of Deninark，to fuffer Provifions for a Month ta be fent into Tonningen． The fcarcity of Wood at that Place hath oblig＇d the Governor to make ufe of the Palifades，and－to pull down the Houfes of one whole Street．It is reported the Princels of Sweden hath at laft re， folyed to accept of the Regency，which hath been feveral times offer＇d her by all the States of that
