Venice, November 17. N. S.

N the 15th, Monfignor Mattei, the late Nuntio, fet out from hence, for his Archdini, his Succeffor, hath notify'd his arrival to the Senate, and is preparing to make his Publick Entry. Signor Andrea Memo, Ambaff.dor to the Ottoman Port, who fet Sail last Week for Constantinople, is arrived in Istria, having escaped a violent Storm that hath done a great deal of Damage in these Parts. A Vessel laden with Salt was call away in the Port of Malamocco. Last Night a Boat funk going to Padua with feveral Paflengers, but only two of them were drowned. They write from Rome, that the Pope was very much out of order, and had been obliged to leave the Imperial Ambaffador in the middle of an Audience. The People of that City were reduced to great Mifery by the Mortality of Gattle, which had occasioned a great dearth of Provisions. Letters from Naples bring an account, that the Vice-Roy had published a Proclamation, by order of the Emperor, forbid ing all Perfons from wearing Gold or Silver Brocades and foreign Silks, and likewife containing feveral Regulations for the better putting in execution the Sumptuary Laws. A British Vessel was come in there from Messina, and brought an account, that the King of Sicily's Troops had taken Poffettion of all the Forts and Caffles in the whole Island : Af-ter which, the Spanifh Forces were ordered to leave the Kingdom immediately. His Majesty had taken upon himfelf the Debts of the Bank, called Monte de Pieta, and had paid the Money lent by the Genoefe with Intereft. Admiral Jennings con-rinued there on the 31ft of October. The Ambul-cade richty laden from I output the state cade, richly laden from London, was likewife ar-rived at Naples. The Convoy, with fome of the Spanish Troops defign'd for Hungary, had fet Sail

The Danish Minister at his Court hath fignified; that the King his Mafter was very much furpriz'd at his Pruffian Maje 1y's Declaration to the Counts Flemming and Golot kin, in-relation to the Affairs of Holftein, which did not at all agree with the good Unit derifanding and Eriendhip that had lasted for inhiby Wears between the two Crowns in That his Marjelty; to flew his define to continue in Peace smould renew the Golferences which Baron Goettz had broke off By his abrupt Departure from Gottorp, and would endeavour to accommodate, Matters and cablysi if the Houfs of Holstein had the fame fincere Intentions : But if they were schlyed to pro-

ceed to open Force, and that other Princes likewife made use of that Pretence to declare against him, he would take his Measures accordingly, and strive to the utmost to repel any Violence that should be offer'd to him. It is faid, the Prussian Ministers are very much divided in their Opinions, whether it be convenient for the King to engage in a War. The Mufcovite Ambaffador hath repeated his A flurances to his Danifh Majefty, that the Czar will continue firm in his Alliance, and fecond him with his whole Force, in cafe he fhould be attack'd in Holftein. The King of Prufia hath writ a very preffing Letter to the King of Denmark, to fuffer Provisions for a Month to be fent into Tonningen. The fcarcity of Wood at that Place hath oblig'd the Governor to make use of the Palifades, and to pull down the Houses of one whole Street. It is reported the Princess of Sweden hath at last refolved to accept of the Regency, which hath been feveral times offer'd her by all the States of that Kingdom. The Polifi, Amhaffador at Adrianople hath fent an Account to King Augustus, that he had agreed Maters. with the Commissioners of the lines, charge the King Staniflaus and his Adhe-rentise the state to King Staniflaus and his Adhe-rentise the state and rejected the Turks Pretentions to part of Ukrain; and had an wer'd conformably to his Influctions about & Paffage for the King of Swe-den through Poland, sit is faid, his Swedifh Ma-jefty is at laft determined to leave the Ottoman for the state and that he will be by Land if he are Territories, and that he will go by Land, if he can agree on certain Points with the Power's through whole Dominions he must pass: But if these Dif-ficulties cannot be adjusted, he will embark at Theffalonica for Marfeilles.

Utrecht, Nauember 28, N.S. On the 25th, the Ministers of Spain and Portugal had a long Conference together, in the Prefence of the Bishop of London, and Yesterday another, in which the Differences that have to long obstructed the Treaty of Peace between those Two Crowns, were brought into so narrow a Compass, that it is hop'd they will soon be entirely adjusted.

Hague, December 1. N.S. Some Days ago Monfieur le Begue, Minister of the Duke of Lorrain, went from hence to Utrecht! Count Pinto is come hither from' that Place, and the Duke d'Ossuna, his Brother, is likewise expected very foon. They write from Franckfort, that Prince Eugene and Mareschal Villars have had an laterview, and agreed upon a Suspension of Arms, but it is pot yet known for how long timer The Armies on both fides were preparing to go into Winter Quarters.
