ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

The Trunk Road (A435) (Evesham Road, Norton, near Evesham) (Restriction of Waiting) Order 19

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order on a length of the Bath-Lincoln Trunk Road (A435) at Norton, near Evesham, in the district of Wychavon, in the county of Hereford and Worcester.

The effect of the Order will be to prohibit waiting between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on any day other than a Sunday on both sides for a distance of 20 metres each side of its junction with Kings Lane.

Exemptions will be provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight from the vehicle, or to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded

from the vehicle, to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the road or the services therein. Exceptions will also be provided for disabled persons' badge holders.

A copy of the proposed draft Order, together with a plan illustrating the proposal and a statement explaining the Secretary of State's reasons for proposing to make an Order may be inspected during office hours at the offices of Hereford and Worcester County Council, County Hall, Spetchley Road, Worcester or at Wychavon District Council, 110 High Street, Evesham, or obtained by application to the Director (Transport), Department of Transport, 5 Broadway, Broad Street, Birmingham B15 1BL.

Any person wishing to object to the Secretary of State's proposal to make the Order should send a written statement of his/her objection and the grounds on which it is made to the Director (Transport) at the above address, quoting ref. WMT 5058/41/5/5, by a date not later than 27th July 1989.
