Whereas under the provisions of section 22 of the Swansea Corporation Water Act 1892 and Licence to Abstract Serial No. 20/56/53/02 the Welsh Water Authority is obliged to discharge into the River Cray from the Cray Reservoir not less than 6.81 megalitres of water per day.

Notice is hereby given that because of an exceptional shortage of rain a serious deficiency of supplies of water exists in the area of the South Western Division of the Welsh Water Authority ("the Authority") and that the Authority, pursuant to powers contained in section 1 of the Drought Act 1976, is about to apply to the Secretary of State for Wales for an Order under section 1 of the said Act of 1976, the general effect of which would be to authorise the Authority for a period not exceeding six months or until such time as the Cray Reservoir shall become full, whichever is the sooner, to reduce the discharge of compensation water from the Cray Reservoir into River Cray from 6.81 megalitres of water per day to 2.27 megalitres of water per day.

A copy of the relevant map or plan showing the location of the discharge point may be inspected by any person free of charge at all reasonable hours within a period of seven days from the date of publication/service of this Notice at the offices of the Authority at Divisional Offices, Pentwyn Road, Nelson, Treharris, Mid Glamorgan, and at 86 The Kingsway, Swansea, and at the Reservoir Keeper's House, Cray Reservoir, Cray, Sennybridge, Powys.

Any objection to this application may be made in writing to the Secretary of State, Welsh Office, Cathays Park, Cardiff CF1 3NQ within the said period of seven days, quoting ref. WEP32/5/1, and should state the grounds of the objection. It is requested that a copy of the objection may at the same time be sent to the undersigned.
