#### **ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984**

The Trunk Road (A361/A39) (Barnstaple By-pass) (24 Hours Clearway) Order 1989

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Transport has for reasons of road safety made an Order which will prohibit vehicles from waiting on any part of the Barnstaple By-pass, other than in laybys.

Exemptions from the prohibition will be made for vehicles being used for the purposes of the police or emergency services, a local authority, postal services, removing traffic obstructions, building or demolition work. The prohibition will also not apply to vehicles waiting because of circumstances outside the control of the driver or while access gates were being opened or closed.

The Order will also prohibit vehicles from waiting either on the carriageway or in the laybys for the purpose of selling goods.

Full details of the prohibitions, exemptions and other provisions are contained in the Order, which is accompanied by a statement of the Secretary of State's reasons for making the Order.

Any person who desires to question the validity of, or any provision contained in the Order, on the ground that it is not within the powers with respect to the Order conferend by the above Act, or on the ground that any requirement of or any Instrument made under any provision of that Act has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may within 6 weeks of 18th July 1989 apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

The North Devon Link Road (Stage 2B) (24 Hours Clearway) Order 1989

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Transport has for reasons of road safety made an Order which will prohibit vehicles from waiting on any part of the North Devon Link Road, other than in laybys.

Exemptions from the prohibition will be made for vehicles being used for the purposes of the police or emergency services, a local authority, postal services, removing traffic obstructions, building or demolition work. The prohibition will also not apply to vehicles waiting because of circumstances outside the control of the driver or while access gates were being opened or closed.
