Legorn, Odol. 21. The Cardinal de Medicis continues ill of a double Tertian Ague, with fuch violent acceffes, that the Court apprehends much danger from his diffemper.

We have here confirmed to us the taking of a Polach of *Tunis* neer Alecant by Six of the Spanish Gallies, after a flipp dispute, in which the General of the Gallies waskilled, and above Sixty of his men.

The Marquis de Martel who Commands a French Squadron of men of war, has neer Tabarka taken a fhip and a Bark of Tunis.

Lifbonne, Octob. 29. This last week came in here four French men of War "who inform that the Count d' Eftre was passed by this place with a Squadron of nine stout French men of war, intending to touch at the Canaries, and from thence to pass along by the Coasts of Affrica as far as Cape de Verde.

Hambourg, Octob. 21. From Stockholm we are told that their Majellies of Swedeland continued their diversions in the Countrey, but were expected the 18th instant at Stockholm; that the Heer Heinstus has given that Court an account of his ill fuccels in his Negotiation in Muscowy; but the late fuccels of the Rebels against the Great Duke may probably induce him to come to fome more reasonable terms of accommodation with the Crown of Sweder.

Five ships which we have long expected here from Mussiony are now happily arrived, with Letters informing us, that many of the people of the looseft convertations, and such as were guilty of some notorious crimes, are fled from Moscow and other places, to the Rebels, who entertain them in their service, and are endeavouring to softify and secure the places of which they have lately possed themselves.

General Wrangel is by an indiposition of body confined in the Island of Oifel; several Swedish Regiments are faid to have lately passed the fea towards Germany, of whom the Danes are faid to have an apprehension.

Asyet nothing 's concluded in the difpute about Regenstein, the Elector of Brandenbourg confirms his pretensions, and has lately produced some evidences, by which he endeavors to prove, that that County has been a Field of Halberstat for the space of above 300 years.

The late involtion of Lorrain has much allarumed the Cantons of Swiggerlant as well as other Countreys; infomuch as the Thirteen Cantons are faid to have joyned in a refolution to raile forces, to fend a confiderable part of them to fecure Baste, and the reft into Franct one?

The Princes of 1 flau's foices are faid to be entred upon the possification + Hombourg, according to an agreement between them and the Prince of Lorrain, to whom it was formerly Mortgaged.

The Elector of Mayenee is levying forces, partly to furnish out his proportion with the rest of the Princes and States of the Empire upon the account of the publick fafety, and partly to entertain under pay the old foldiers who might otherwise be tempted to pass into some other Countrey, and to take an employment to the differvice of the Empire.

From Vienna we are told, that the Count Schafgots is gone for Poland to affift at the Queens Coronation, but is inftructed to invite the States of that kingdom to draw their forces together to joyn with the Empetors Army, in cafe the Turks floud be induced to make any attempt upon either Nation.

Bruffols, Nov. 7. Yesterday in the evening his Excellency the Count de Monterey returned hither bringing with him his Lady, whom he received upon the frontiers of France, from whence the came on Tuesday last to Mons, and from thence the next day to Enguyen, and was in all places by which she past, faluted by the Great Guns, and entertained with all other marks of refpect imaginable ; fhe intends for fome days to continue here privately, till fit preparation be made for her folemn entry, which tis believed will be deferred till the 11th initant, that being alfo the birth-day of the young King of Spain, who then enters into the 10th year of his age.

Letters of the 1ft inftant from Triers tell us, that the Duke of Lorrain, who had paffed fome time in the neighborhood, went thence to Coblents to vifit the Elector their Archbishop, who having by a Courier received Letters from the Emperor, which much pleased him, he departed thence intending for Mayence, there to meet with the Elector of that name, lately for that purpose returned from Wurtsbourg; about the fame time passed by Triers Two Ambassaddors from the Swiffes son to the Duke of Lorrain3, who may also find him at Mayence.

In the mean time the French are taking up their Winter Quatters in Lorrain, the Royal Regiment confifting of 23 Companies are already quattered in Nancy, with the Troop of Guards belonging to the Marefhal de Crequy, and another Troop in the Bayliwick, and the Country obliged to furnish them with all Conveniencies.

Paris, Nov. 8. On Wednefday last the Marquis de Louvoy went hence for Flanders to visit the fortifications, and to take a view of the several Garrisons; he intends also to look into the business of Trade, to encourage (as much as possible), that of Lille and Tournay, and endeavor to draw thither the Commerce of all the neighbouring Spanish Towns.

merce of all the neighbouring Spanish Towns. Yesterday went hence the Provost *des Merchands* of *Lyonne*, carrying with him some priviledges granted by his most Christian Majesty for the establishment of the manufactory of Linnen Cloth az *Tarrare*.

The 2d inftant the Bishop of Mets took his oath of fidelity after the usual manner between the hands of his Majesly; and the same day the Envoye Extraordinary from the Great Duke of Tuscany was introduced to his Audience from his Majesty at St Germains, by the Sieur de Berlise, the usual Officer for the Introduction of Ambastadors; the same afternoon their Majesties went thence to Versailles.

The Marquis d' Angeau, who was defigned by his Majefty to be fent into Smedeland with the Character of Ambassador, fets not forwards on that employment till the next Spring.

His Majefty has ordered it to be publisher in all places of the frontiers of *Franche Comte* that all such French as are now within that County, immediately return into his Dominions upon pain of death.

The Duke of Lorrain is visiting feveral of the Princes of Germany, to follicite their assistance for the recovery of his Countrey.

The Elector of Cologne, the Duke of Bavaria, the Bishop of Strasbourg, with some others, are defigning to meet in consultation at Munchen, whither his Majesty intends to send his Minister to consider of the present state of affairs in relation to the interest of France.

We are lately advifed that Two fhips belonging to the Eafl India Company, which left Port Louis on the 9th of May, arrived the 19th of June in the Road of Cape de Vert; and that op the 23 of the fame month the fhip called the Crowned Dolphin, came alfo thither, and intended to pais thence together in company the beginning of the next month. The Squadron under the Command of the Sieur de 1a Haye, had watered at the fame place, and failed thence the 10th of May.

Portfmouth Novem. 5. The third inftant arrived in St Hellens road Sir Thomas Allen, late Admiral of His Majeflies Fleet in the Streights, who left Cadiz the 19th of the laft month, in company with two fmall Briftot thips laden from St Lucar.
