(a) the relevant provisions of the International Telecommunication Convention and the Radio Regulations thereunder, in particular (without limiting the generality of the foregoing), articles 31 and 35 of the Convention, and article 35 of the Radio Regulations; and

(b) the relevant statutes and statutory instruments including (without limiting the generality of the foregoing) the Act, the Wireless Telegraphy Act 1967 and the Telecommunications Act 1984.

Inspection and Close Down

7. The Licensee shall permit a person authorised by the Secretary of State:

a) to have access to the Apparatus; and

(b) to inspect the Licence and to inspect the Apparatus

at any and all reasonable times (or when, in the opinion of the Secretary of State, an urgent situation exists, at any time) for the purpose of verifying compliance with the terms of the License.

8. When, in the opinion of the Secretary of State:

a) the Licensee is in breach of the Licence; and

(b) the breach justifies immediate restriction or close down, the Licensee shall restrict the operation of, or close down and cease to operate, any Apparatus forthwith in accordance with the demand of a person authorised by the Secretary of State for the temporary period specified in the demand.

Period of Licence and Fees Due

9. (1) Subject to the payment of the fee in the manner indicated in sub-clause (2), the Licence shall continue in force from year to year unless revoked by the Secretary of State

(2) The Licensee shall pay to the Secretary of State, before the date for renewal set forth above (the "Date for Renewal") in each year the fee on renewal prescribed by the Regulations for

the time being in force under section 2(1(of the Act. (3) If the Licensee does not pay the fee in the manner described in sub-clause (2), then the Licence shall expire at the end of the day before the Date for Renewal in the relevant year. (4)Any licence, however described, which the Secretary of State has previously granted to the Licensee under the Act in respect of any of the Apparatus is revoked.

Notice of Variation or Revocation

- 10. Where the Secretary of State exercises his power to revoke or vary all Maritime Radio (Navigational Aid and Radar) Licences in accordance with section 1(4) of the Act, a general notice to all holders of such licences shall be published:
 - (a) by a broadcast by the British Broadcasting Corporation; or
 - (b) in the London, Edinburgh and Belfast Gazettes.

Interpretation

11. (1) In this Licence, unless the context otherwise requires:

(a) The Interpretation Act 1978 applis to this Licence as it applies to an ACt of Parliament; and

(b) "inspect" "examine and test"; and

(c) any reference to the International Telecommunication Convention and any Radio Regulations thereunder includes any Convention or Regulation which may from time to time be enacted or brought into force in substitution for, in amendment of, or in addition to, the International Telecommunication Convention or Radio Regulations.

(2) The headings in this Licence are for ease of reference only and will not affect the interpretation of the Licence. (3) The Schedule to the Licence is incorporated in, and forms a part of, the Licence.
