Notice is hereby given, that the Council of the London Borough of Merton, after consulting the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, in exercise of power conferred by section 6 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 have made the above-mentioned Order on 28th March 1990. The Order will come into operation on 3rd June 1990.

The General effects of the Order will be to further amend the London Borough of Merton (Off-Street Parking Places) Order 1979, so that the item that refers to Queens Road Car Park is deleted. The car park will be closed to the public. Part of the land is to be used for the provision of the two level basement public car park within the Wimbledon Town Hall development and should be available for use by the public upon completion of the development which is anticipated to be in early 1993. The long term parking section of the car park will also be re-opened at this time.

It should be noted that the number of spaces available will be restricted from 8th April 1990, under section 11 of the Off-Street Parking Places Order 1979, and a new temporary access road to the remainder will be provided adjacent to the new Baptist Church until

the car park is permanently closed.

Exemptions to the provisions of the Order are given for emergency vehicles and anything done with the permission or at the direction of

a police constable in uniform.

A copy of the Order, the Council's Statement of Reasons and a plan of the area affected by the Order can be inspected during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays until 11th May 1990, in the Main Reception, Crown House, London Road, Morden SM4 5DX. The Notice of Proposal of the Order was published in the London Gazette (Issue No. 52036, ref. 486) on 2nd February 1990.

Any person desiring to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or on the grounds that any requirement of the Act, or of any Instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within 6 weeks from the date of which the Order was made, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

The general effects of the Orders will be:

(iii) to designate free parking areas in accordance with the Merton (Free Parking Places) (No. 1) Order 1978 in Thornton Hill;

Exemptions are provided in the Order to permit vehicles to wait:

(a) to enable passengers to board or alight and to load or unload their personal luggage:

for up to twenty minutes for the purpose of delivering/collecting goods or loading/unloading the vehicle at premises adjacent to the street except between the hours of 8 a.m. and 11 a.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive;

(c) if they are being used to maintain the road or the services therein or by local authorities or the Post Office in pursuance to

statutory powers and duties.
