Gough of Fenemere Manor, Baschurch, Shrewsbury, Shropshire SY4 2JG, to vary licence serial number 18/54/3/171/S to abstract water from Fenemere at NGR SJ446 228 and SJ446 230 in the Parish of Baschurch in the district of North Shropshire.

The variation applied for is: (the water is to be abstracted for spray irrigation), from 4,400,000 gallons to 12,000,000 gallons, and also to include the land at the New Holding, Eyton, Baschurch, the hourly quantity to be increased from 34 cubic metres to 68 cubic metres, the daily quantity to be increased from 636 cubic metres to 1,272 cubic metres, the yearly abstraction from 20,000 cubic metres to 54,545-45 cubic metres.

CANTERBURY CITY COUNCIL

The Canterbury City Council (Canterbury) (Prohibition of Waiting Amendment No. 27 and Street Parking Places Amendment No. 20) Order 1990.

Notice is hereby given that on 30th March 1990 the Canterbury City Council made the above Order under the provisions of sections 1 and 32 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as Agent of the Kent County Council as Highway Authority.

The Order came into effect on 2nd April 1990 and has the effect as described in issue 52036 dated 2nd February 1990 of the *London Gazette* (ref. 723) with the exception that the proposed prohibition of waiting at any time on the north-east side of Marshwood Close, Canterbury between points 60 feet and 270 feet from its junction with Sturry Road has been altered to become a prohibition of waiting between 8 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. and the proposed prohibition of waiting at any time in Sturry Road between points 98 feet and 130 feet east of its junction with South Street has been deleted.

Full details are contained in the Orders which, together with copies of the relevant plans, may be examined at the Chief Executive and Twon Clerk's Department, Canterbury City Council, Military Road, Canterbury, Kent, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 4.30 p.m., Mondays to Fridays.

If you wish to question the validity of the Orders or any provision contained in them, on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the 1984 Act or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any Instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Orders, you may within 6 weeks from 30th March 1990, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

CHESTER CITY COUNCIL

Traffic Regulation Orders

Notice is hereby given that on 6th April 1990 the Council of the City of Chester pursuant to arrangements made under the Local Government Act 1972 with Cheshire County Council made the following Orders in accordance with the provisions of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The effects of the Orders which will come into operation on the 9th April 1990 will be as follows:

The City of Chester (Hunter Street Service Roads) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1990

To prohibit waiting at any time on the following:

The service road at the rear of the library which lies between Hunter Street and Princess Street:

(i) from its junction with Hunter Street for a distance of 10 metres in a southerly direction;

(ii) from its junction with Princess Street for a distance of 9 metres in a northerly direction.

The access road off Hunter Street to the rear of Kings Buildings from its junction with Hunter Street for a distance of 24 metres in a northerly direction.

(This notification supersedes any previous notification of the implementation of this Order.)

The City of Chester (Caughall Road, Upton-by-Chester) (Prohibition of Left Turn) Order 1990

To prohibit any vehicle proceeding in Caughall Road to make a left turn into the main carriageway of the A41 at Upton-by-Chester.
