WILTSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Wiltshire (High Street, Chippenham) (Weight Restriction) Order 1990

Notice is hereby given that on 3rd April 1990, the Wiltshire County Council made an Order under sections 1, 2 and 3 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which will be to prohibit heavy commercial vehicles, having an operating weight in excess of 7.5 tonnes, from proceeding along the following length of road in Chippenham:

Town Bridge/High Street, from the junction with Bath Road/New Road to the junction with the Market Place.

Exemptions will be provided to enable such vehicles to proceed along the roads, which are subject to the weight restriction, to gain access to premises, or in connection with building operations, or demolition, situated on or adjacent to the roads, the removal of obstructions, the laying, erection, alteration or repair of any statutory undertakers' apparatus or any telegraphic line, or whilst vehicles are being used in the service of the local authority, in pursuance of statutory powers or duties, or in the service of the Police Authority, Fire Brigade or Ambulance Service in a case of emergency.

A copy of the Order and Plan may be inspected at the Chief Executive's Department, County Hall, Trowbridge, during normal office hours.

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity of the Order, or of any provision contained in the Order on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the relevant section of the above Act, or on the grounds that any requirement of that section, or of Part III of Schedule 9 of the Act, or any regulation made under the said Schedule, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within 6 weeks of the date on which the Order was made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

The Order will be operative as from 1st May 1990.
